QUARTER REPORT SHOWS ACTIVITIES POWER COMPANY

Local shareholders of the California Oregon Power company have just received the regular quarterly report of their company's activities during the past three-month period. This report, which accompanied the 29th regular dividend on a Copco preferred stock, not only reflects the steady development of the company but also indicates the marked growth of the many communities served by this well-known local utility. Net earnings for the past 12 months show a consistent gain over the preceding 12-month period, indicating an increase in the number of customers served, as well as a greater use of electricity by the residents of this rapidly growing territory. Other interesting subjects covered in the Copco report include the following:

Construction has been started on a new garage, shop and pole yard in the city of Klamath Falls.

In Roseburg it has been found necessary to build a combination warehouse and storehouse in the rear of the Empqua division office building to take care of increased business.

Rate reductions representing a considerable saving to domestic and commercial lighting customers became effective October 1. These reductions apply to all urban domestic lighting customers and to both urban and rural commercial light customers, affecting approximately 13,000 or 60 per cent of customers' bills.

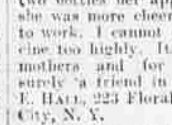
One morning after that the husband and father told them goodbye and started off to work in their car. That night at the time when he usually arrived no one showed up.
