PIPES CITIZEN'S CANDIDATE MAYOR LARGE TAX PAYER

ORDER OF SAMARITANS TO HAVE CEREMONIAL ASHLAND OCTOBER 27

It was instituted a few years ago to meet the demand for more latitude in amusement and recreation than is permissible in the subordinate and other branches of Odd Fellowship.

There will be a meeting at 7:30 p. m. for the purpose of obligating transfers and the ceremonial or initiation of new members will begin at 8 o'clock. The ceremonial will be followed by a banquet prepared by the ladies of Hope Rebekah lodge of Ashland, for which there will be a charge of 75 cents.

The ceremonial will be staged by the Granite Pass team. If sufficient members arrive in Ashland by 7 p. m. a street parade will be held, in which will be interspersed a number of stunts.

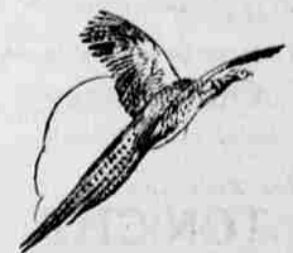

Six priceless bulbs of the new yellow tulip which bears her name, arrived as a gift to her from the famous De Graaf Bulb company of Holland, who developed the new species within the last two years. The plants were sent with a shipment of rare bulbs to the Monarch Seed and Feed company, with a message to deliver them to the local girl.

Two years ago, when Miss Voorhies was returning from an European tour, she met John De Graaf, member of the old Holland firm, on board ship, where the two became friends. Last year, Mr. De Graaf made a second trip to America and visited at the Voorhies home, where he told Miss Voorhies about the new bulb then under observation, which was to be named for her. It is the only yellow Darwin tulip ever produced, not to be offered for sale on any market, a fact which makes them the De Graaf bulbs all over the world, the Marion Voorhies will girl who inspired them.
