

MYSTERY CLOUDS STUDENT RETURN AFTER KIDNAPING

OAKLAND, Cal., Oct. 25.—(AP)—Craig Lewis, 22, University of California student registered from Huntington Beach, was back with friends today after being mysteriously missing since October 8.

The youth was found bound and gagged late last night on the porch of his fiancée's home. He showed signs of rough treatment, including a welt on the side of his head like the mark of a blow with a club. Police said he was too dazed to give a coherent account of what had happened to him.

Lewis' fiancée, Miss June Cochran, found the student when she opened the door to investigate a noise on the front porch. She said his hands were tied, a gag was in his mouth, and a shoe was in his hand.

"They got me," the girl said. "Lewis muttered, 'I got away,' but they got me again. They hit me. I was given plenty."

Miss Cochran and her sister, Alice, said they unlocked Lewis and took him into the house. Police were called, and spent more than an hour questioning him without learning anything of importance.

Lewis is the son of H. L. Lewis, oil operator at Huntington Beach. His father came here to join in the search for his son.

Lewis' fiancée reported him missing after his automobile was found deserted in front of his boarding house here. His books and other belongings were in the machine.

Police said the youth might have been kidnaped by gangsters from whom he later escaped.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25.—(AP)—Douglas Fairbanks computes his income in one way: the government adds it up in another. Consequently, the famous picture star with his wife, the equally famous Mary Pickford, were in town today to keep an appointment at the treasury. Something over a million dollars was at stake.

The government contends that Fairbanks owes exactly \$12,000, \$27,575 in unpaid federal taxes. It asserts that Pickford also is delinquent, but to what extent has not been revealed. The dispute centers on the method by which the stars valued their pictures.

A NEW YORKER AT LARGE

NEW YORK.—A retired Boston business man of means desired to respond to the celebration of his friends upon the eighty-fifth anniversary of his birth. So he came down to New York on his birthday and delivered a brief speech of thanks in the recording laboratories of a photograph company. Records were made of it, and one was sent to each of his friends in acknowledgment of their good wishes.

A camera maker who is himself a collector of ability has records of his own collection of sales made in each holiday season to send to his customers with his Christmas greetings. A woman Spiritualist leader of Pennsylvania helps to spread the teachings of her faith by making photograph records containing hymns and talks. Four or five thousand such records have been disseminated among Spiritualists all over the country.

There are a few instances of "personal record making" which has become an important sideline at several laboratories in and around New York where photograph records are manufactured. Several smaller producers have made a specialty of it, and have made it possible for anybody who wants a permanent record of his own voice to have it made for him at a cost which in some instances is as little as \$20.

Objective Listening
A number of metropolitan music conservatories bring their pupils at regular intervals to recording laboratories to sing or play. The records that are made are used primarily by the pupils themselves, so that they may listen to themselves and be enabled to correct mistakes. Often, too, the pupils have copies of the records made and use them as gifts.

It has become the vogue for society women who take frequent part in musicales to have records made of their singing and to take them to social gatherings, where they sing one selection themselves and then play several records they have made.

Mrs. Myron C. Taylor, whose husband is chairman of the finance committee of the United States Steel corporation, has some for eight records, and has had a dozen copies of each made for her own record library and for those of her friends. Miss Florence Wessell, New York music teacher, among

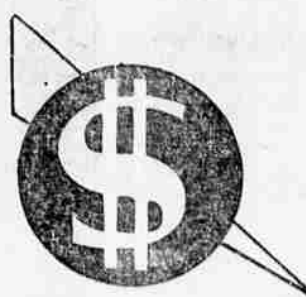
whose pupils are the children of a number of distinguished families makes records of her own singing for the parents of her pupils and helps the children to make records their parents may keep.
