From the outset our chief interest has been the election of Herbert Hoover as President of the United States, because we believe his success will materially benefit the people of this section, and every other section of the country.

Regarding certain candidates and issues, we have endeavored to maintain a certain attitude of detachment. The Mail Tribune has no axe to grind, no favorites to play.

Voting for a local candidate simply because he happens to belong to this party or that eliminates individual capability as a political factor.

What we are interested in, and what we believe a majority of the people of Jackson county are interested in as far as city and county affairs are concerned, is not the triumph of any political organization.

To attain this goal party distinctions should be regarded, not as an end in themselves, but merely as a means toward an end, party candidates being supported only when they contribute to this condition.

Medford has been exceedingly fortunate in the high quality of its administrative officials the past 10 years. Capable and representative business men have served year in year out without pay, asking only that satisfaction which comes from the consciousness of disinterested public service well done.
