To the Editor of the Mail Tribune: In the Medford Mail Tribune of October 9 there appeared an editorial with headlines "Defeat the State Income Tax."

The writer of this editorial either does not know the law or does not want to play fair. The federal law covering the taxing of national banks provides that national banks can be taxed on their property, on their stock or on their income, but not in all three ways.

If the Mail Tribune thinks this is a defect in the income measure that is to be on the ballot November 6, and if they can suggest any way that it can be amended so that we can tax the income of national banks, as well as their property, we will be glad to present such an amendment at the next session of the legislature and urge the adoption of such amendment to the income tax law as approved by the people, so as to tax it.

The editorial continues that another good reason for the defeat of the present income tax is that we have a committee authorized by the legislature making an exhaustive study of the tax situation in Oregon. That survey is not complete and the committee has not reported. This is pure "bunk," for we had several such tax investigation committees appointed in the past, and each of them has recommended an income tax as a means of redistributing the tax burden that now rests almost entirely on visible property.

The above excuse of the Mail Tribune is similar to other excuses we hear, such as: "The income tax is all right, but this is not the right time to adopt it," or "Wait until all the other states have one." Thirteen states now have an income tax.
