

PORTLAND MARKET PREPARES DISPLAY FOR APPLE WEEK

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 29.—(By National Apple Week begins tomorrow and local jobbers were preparing displays of their choicest offerings today. Although movement of apples has been flat during the past week or two, demand has not been overly active. All kinds of apples are being offered here, including Delicious, Greenings, Grimes Golden, Jonathans, Kings, Rome Beauties, Spencers, Outlaws, Winter Bannans, Yellow Newtowns, Northern Spys and Staymans. Prices show a wide range from 50c per box for jumble apples and small mixed sizes up to \$2.75 for the most desirable grades of wrapped and packed stock. Hot house tomatoes from eastern Washington and Oregon were also being offered, most sales totaling \$3.50 per 20 lb. box. Although receipts of fresh eggs were high yesterday, standard extras were a cent lower at 48c while both medium grades were off 2c per dozen at 34c. Peewees were also selling a cent lower at 24c. The declines had no apparent weakening effect on prices. Shippers were offering today on eggs meeting the New York extra standard, offers holding firm at 50c, 51c per dozen. The tone of the butter market was fully steady with buyers looking for no changes to speak of in either direction during the next week or two. Poultry values were firm and supplies of desirable stock were. Shipping demand for heavy well matured turkeys is beginning to develop, commission men report, and growers are being advised not to ship anything except this class for another week or two.

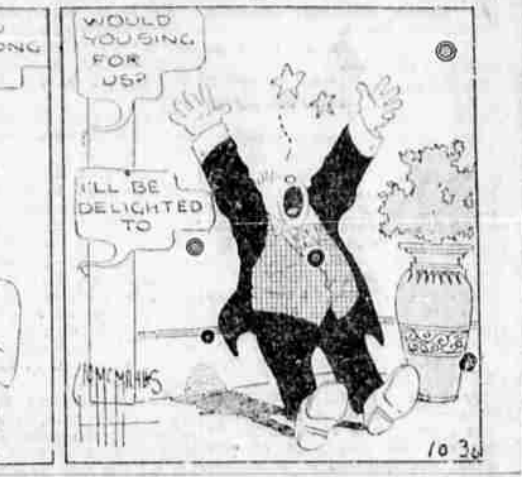
