Ex-Jury Praises Thomas

I have been reading the accounts of the trial of the late Judge Thomas in the Medford Mail Tribune. I was in the court room at this time and of course knew just exactly what happened. Eight days later Judge Leavitt appeared to try this case. At once on opening court E. E. Kelly asked for a continuance of this case. Judge Leavitt told him that he had had eight days in which to get his client, who was in California, into court, and that this case would be tried at once. Mr. Kelly made some remark about how he would have to have an airplane to get his client here, and Judge Leavitt said "Mr. Kelly the jury will be drawn at 1 o'clock and you must be prepared to try this case." The case was tried and Mr. Kelly lost.

I was on this jury and I know what I am talking about, and I am only citing this incident to show you that there is a certain class of lawyers here that have no desire to expedite court business, and in my judgment have a very strong desire to harass Judge Thomas on every occasion. 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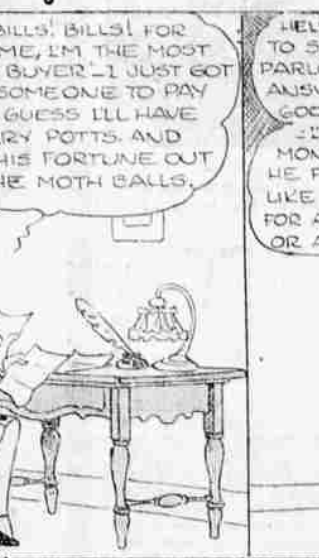
