### 205-Pounder Gets Herb's Old Post

MINNEAPOLIS.—(AP)—When Dr. C. W. Spears, Minnesota coach, cast about for a player to try to fill the place of Herb Joesting, twice All-American fullback, it didn't take him long to decide on Bronko Nagurski.

The Minnesota coach had to apologize to make for his choice after the first Minnesota game this fall, for the Bronko gained more ground than any other player on the field. One of his charges was good for 34 yards.

Although six-foot tall and weighing 205 pounds, Nagurski in the second fastest man on the Minnesota squad. And the Gophers as a whole have a reputation in the Big Ten for their speed.

Nagurski, a native of the Canadian border country, came to Minnesota as a backfield candidate. Dr. Spears shot him into the line, first as an end, then as a tackle. His speed placed him in good stead in both positions. And it was his speed that brought him his chance as a ball carrier. He is a junior.

### NOTRE DAME LIST OF CRIPPLES IS LARGER BY THREE

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Nov. 6.—(AP)—Notre Dame's already large list of cripples has been increased by three first stringers, two of whom were injured in the Penn State game Saturday.

Jimmy Brady, quarterback, is laid up with an injured knee that caused his removal from the game in the first period, and Ed Collins, who played a great game at left end, is in the hospital with an arm infection. Jack Chevigny, star right halfback, is ill of tonsillitis. Victory over Penn State has put fight back into Knute Rockne's football team and enthusiasm is running high over prospects for a victory over the Army.

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 6.—(AP)—The average football player in the larger universities brings \$10,000 to his school through gate receipts and endowments, but gets nothing in return but cracked ribs and mean looks from stern professors for falling in his studies. James Weber Linn, professor of English at the University of Chicago, said yesterday.

Speaking before a group of football enthusiasts, Professor Linn said: "Many of the big universities clear \$200,000 a year in their football season. That's \$600,000 for the players' three years of eligibility. Divide that by a squad of 60 men and it means each player has paid \$10,000 in the gate receipts alone. What does he get in return? Only the opportunity to sweat blood and crack ribs on the field and try to keep up with his studies. Why, he ought to have the best special attention obtainable."

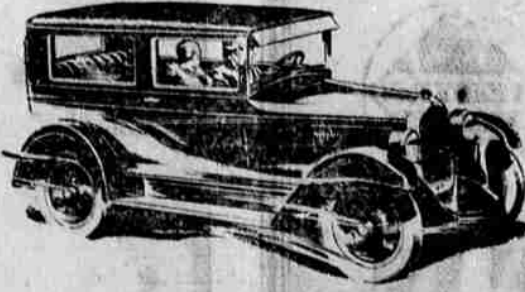

BERKELEY, Cal., Nov. 6.—(AP)—The University of California gridmen prepared for a hard workout today, probably their last stiff practice before leaving for Seattle late tomorrow to meet the Washington Huskies Saturday.

The Bears went through only a light lumbering up drill yesterday, but it was enough to show that every man on the squad, with the exception of Bert Schwarz, guard, is in top notch condition. Schwarz was out of a uniform with a slight knee infection, but he will probably be around in time for the game.

The California gridmen, 30 strong, accompanied by Coach "Nibs" Price, Trainer Charlie Volz and a flock of California supporters, will leave for the north tomorrow aboard the Cascade. The California band, composed of 60 members, will leave for Seattle Thursday to spur on the Bears in their last conference test before meeting Stanford in the annual "big game."

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 6.—(AP)—Coach Bill Spaulding having worked out a bagful of offensive plays to be used against Washington State at Portland next Saturday, today set about sharpening up the defense of his University of California at Los Angeles football squad in a workout against the Cougars' "jet" plays.

Spaulding has several of the best plays of the stater well defined and he expects to be able to spoil some of the line plunging of "Rosy" Hein, Cougar scoring ace.
