

GOV. PATTERSON FOR OBSERVANCE OF LEGION WEEK

Governor I. L. Patterson has sent the following letter to 511 American Legion posts in the state:

To the People of Oregon: I am glad to express my commendation of the observance of the week beginning November 11th and ending November 17th as American Legion week. The American Legion in the first ten years of its history has, by its program of unselfish service to community, state and nation, demonstrated that it is a great power for good. It has made provision for the treatment and rehabilitation of those who were disabled in the World war, looked after the welfare of children who were left fatherless, and exerted its every effort toward the promotion of the best interests of the nation and the promulgation of the principles of citizenship on which our country was founded.

The people of the state of Oregon appreciate the work that is being carried on by the American Legion and by the American Legion Auxiliary. These two service organizations are entitled to full cooperation and assistance in their efforts to maintain their full membership during the coming year. I therefore urge that every citizen aid the Legion and the Legion Auxiliary in their membership campaign and particularly urge those who are eligible but are not now members of the Legion or the Auxiliary to take this opportunity of enrolling and becoming associated in the great work of these two patriotic organizations.

GOVERNOR MOODY SEES RASKOB AS SMITH HANDICAP

AUSTIN, Tex., Nov. 7.—John Raskob, manager of the Democratic national campaign was criticized in a statement issued here last night by Governor Dan Moody, which said that the popular vote given Smith was "a magnificent personal tribute and that the south is still solidly Democratic at heart."

"Unfortunately for Governor Smith and the Democrats, the management of the campaign was entrusted to Mr. Raskob, a cynical commercialist with an alcoholic complex, who has no conception of the attitude or ideas prevailing in the south or west. The statements which he persisted in issuing had a tendency to drive voters from the Democratic party which all the regular Democrats in the south could not overcome."

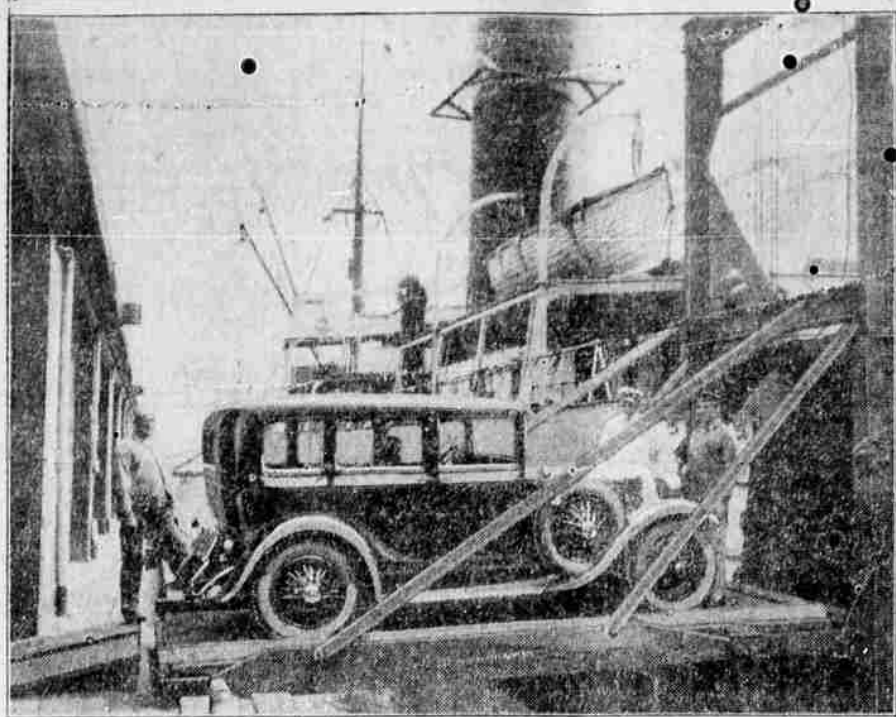
"The larger popular vote which Governor Smith received is a magnificent tribute to him. He ran the race of a strong and sincere man. The people of the south voted their intense convictions on the prohibition question. The Republicans can take no heart in the vote their ticket received in the south, for the south in sentiment and feeling is still solidly Democratic. TABULATION GIVES HOOVER OHIO VOTE

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 7.—Herbert Hoover's majority in Ohio over Governor Alfred E. Smith had reached approximately 600,000 when returns from 35 per cent of the state had been tabulated today. The president-elect's majority swelled with each additional batch of precincts.

Myers Y. Cooper's majority for governor over Congressman Martin L. Davey, Democrat, had swelled to 213,600 on returns from 39 per cent of the state. The remaining precincts more than 1700 in number, were expected to increase his majority.

United States senator, full term: 7059 precincts give Simon D. Fess, 1,950,423; Charles V. Truman, 698,746.

United States senator, short term: Theodore E. Burton, 1,047,194; Graham P. Hunt, 660,902.

LONG SKIRT VOGUE SLOW IN ARRIVAL

PARIS, France, Nov. 7.—The gradualness with which skirts are being lengthened, as well as some women's flat refusal to lengthen them at all, indicates the old days of overnight style revolutions are over.

The style makers are contenting themselves with easing skirts down inch by inch on daytime clothes. So far, their tactics of dropping evening skirts to any level that happens to suit their idea has not resulted in the lengthening of street skirts.

Skirts are a few inches longer, to be sure, than they were six months ago. They now cover the knees entirely at all but one or two fashionable dress houses. But the fashion centers are repeatedly asked to shorten the street models as they are duplicated and time after time hear their clients say: "The long skirts are all right for the magazines, but they don't look smart on the street."

Despite the slowness of French women's conformity to their dress-makers' wishes they wear longer skirts, on the whole, than American or English.

Chesterfields Used On Byrd Expedition

How many cigarettes a day does a man need when the thermometer reads sixty below zero? Evidently Commander Richard E. OMAHA, Nov. 7.—Down today found Nebraska, "the doubtful" safely in the Republican column in its major races.

The Hoover majority over Governor Alfred E. Smith, with half returns, was approximately 40,000 votes.

United States Senator R. B. Howell, Republican, was virtually assured re-election with more than 750 precincts giving him a 40,000 majority over Richard L. Metcalfe, Democratic opponent.

All state officers were re-elected. Arthur J. Weaver, running for the first time for governor, went far ahead of Chas. W. Bryan, his Democratic opponent.
