

DAVIES ELECTED NEW CITY MAYOR AT EAGLE POINT

EAGLE POINT, Ore., Nov. 9.—(Special.) The town of Eagle Point held a full list of town officers up for election. Politics has been in abeyance here for some time so it was decided that the town of all officers should be considered as having expired, and an entirely new board elected. Prof. C. F. Davies had no opposition for mayor and was elected by 75 votes. Mr. Campbell had only one vote against him for treasurer. Floyd Pearce was re-elected recorder.

R. T. Seaman, Floyd Willson and Sam May were elected councilmen for four years, and Geo. Phillips, Mr. Garrett and Jack Stowell councilmen for two years.

The issues before the people were a better water supply for the town and the regulation of the public dances. It is hoped that a satisfactory solution of both these problems may be found by the new council.

The election called forth a very large vote, 314 votes being cast, almost a 100 percent increase. The result did not seem to surprise anyone. Some have been heard from who, while they voted for Smith, bet on Hoover. Sentiment and business judgment seem thus to have often entered into conflict, and business judgment won.

The dinner by the Ladies Aid society at Brown's hall was very largely patronized on election day, and the ladies turned in a goodly sum to their treasury as a result.

In spite of the distractions incident to the election, there was an unusually large attendance at the dance on Tuesday evening. A radio was installed in the Grange hall which reported the election news as it came in.

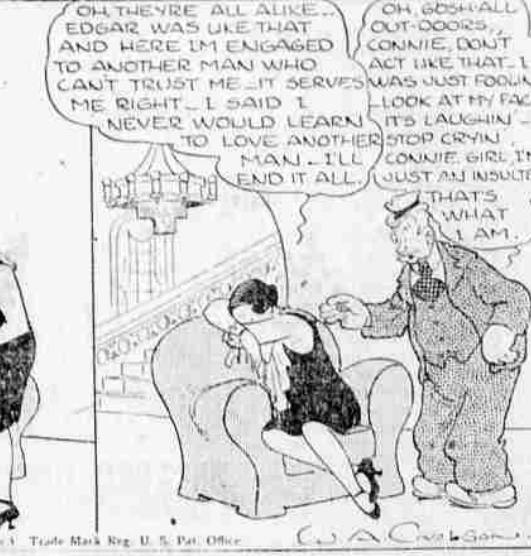
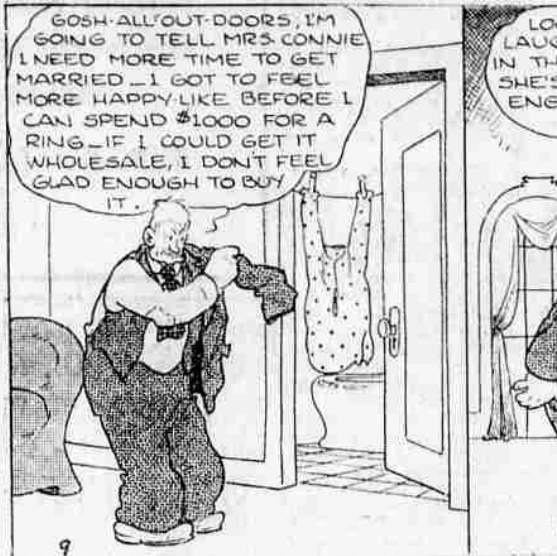
