

VALUES MAINTAINED WHOLESALE TRADING PORTLAND MARKET

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 10.—(AP) Wholesale trading on local fruit and produce markets was fairly active in the early hours today, and values of most commodities were well maintained.

Cranberries were selling steadily around \$6 per 1-3 barrel box this morning, but dealers were predicting an advance early next week. Eastern berries held around \$22 per barrel.

In the butter and egg division there were several price changes. Standard cube butter advanced 1 cent to 49c per pound, but other grades held steady. Both grades of extra eggs declined, standard extras dropping a cent to 48c while the medium extras declined two cents to 56c per dozen. Peeves, on the other hand, advanced two cents to 28c.
