Governor Smith is fond of pets... here he is with one of his favorites.



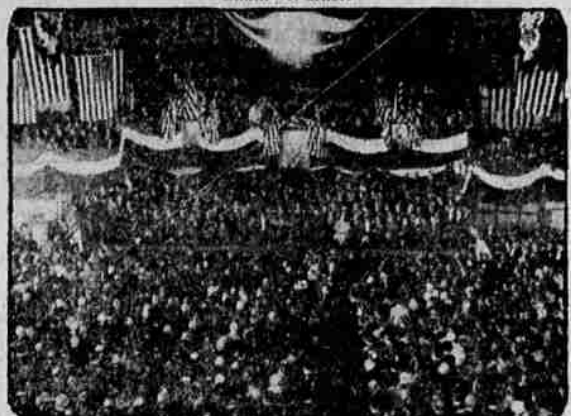

Golf is Governor Smith's chief means of recreation. Here he is on the links.



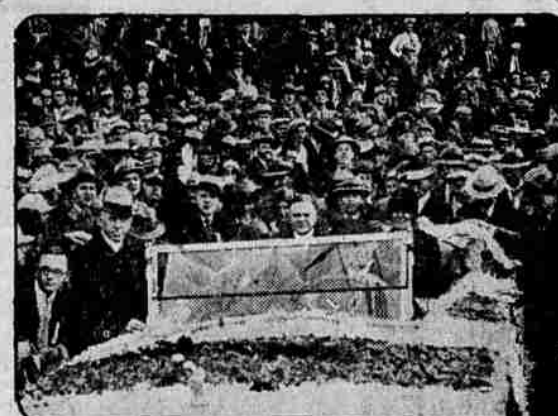
Here is a typical Smith campaign meeting... the one that greeted his speech in Chicago, near the end of the campaign.



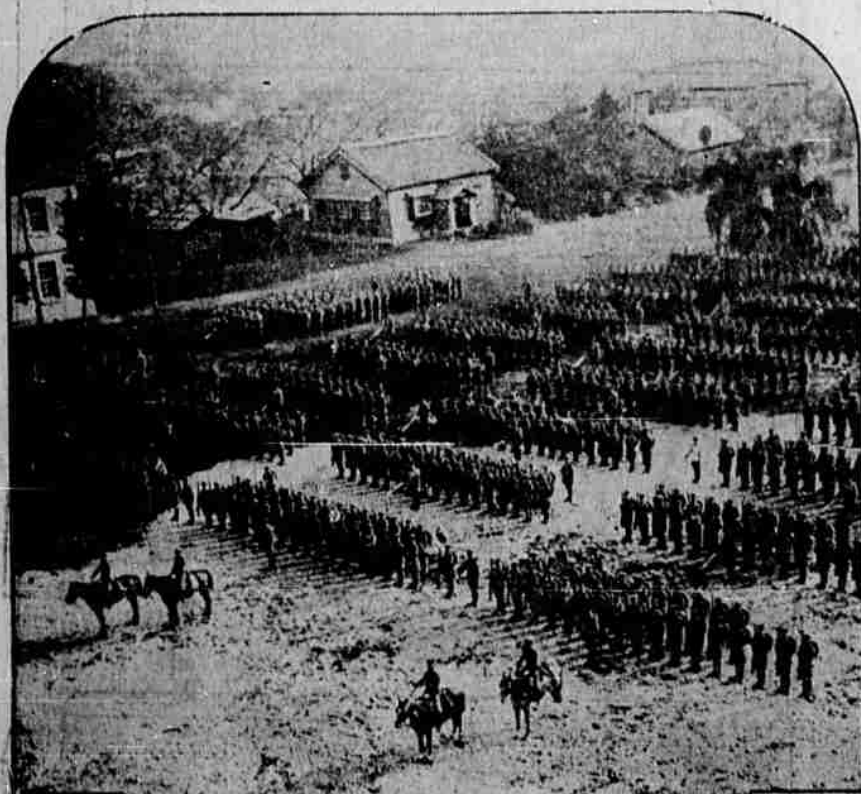
Secretary Hoover is an ardent radio fan. Here he is listening in via the earphones.

HIGH STEPPING is an absolute essential for all dancers—and pretty Doris Hill undertakes to show the world how well qualified for the job she is.



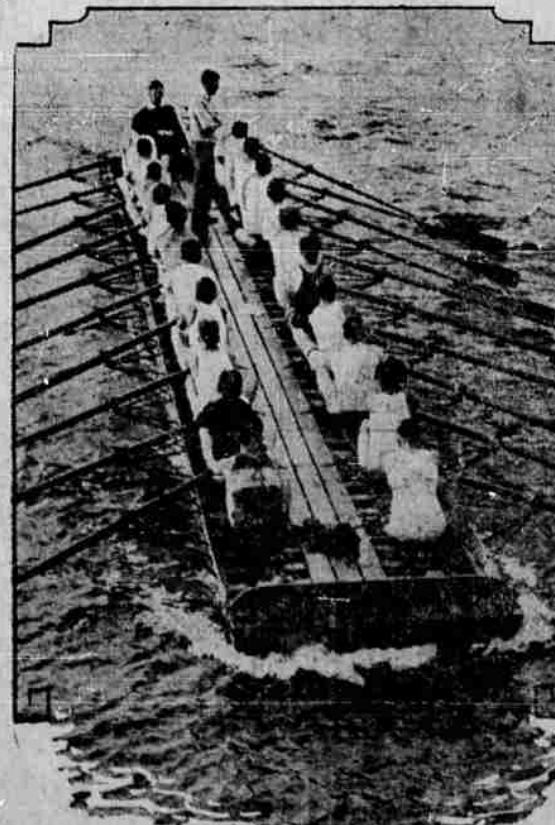
