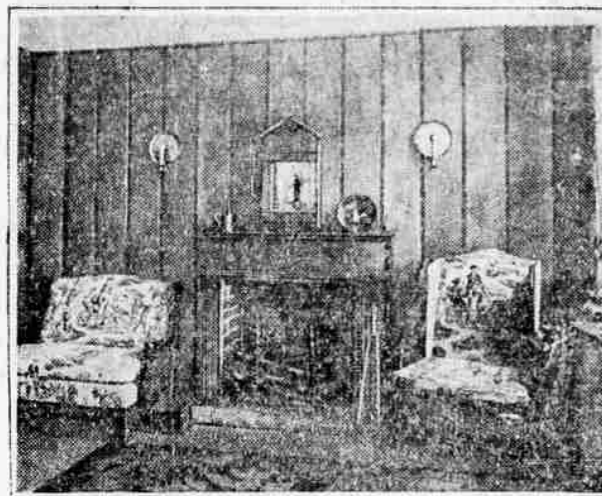

## Home Decoration

Housewives having problems on interior-decoration will find this column interesting. Queries may be addressed to the editor of this page, care Mail Tribune.

Query: We have a glassed in sleeping porch which has French windows. How should they be curtained? Mrs. D. L. L.

Answer: Very dainty glass curtains may be gathered on two rods and fastened to the window frames. Permanent finish organ-die or voile is recommended for these, or if very airy over drapes are used the natural theatrical gauze is inexpensive. These materials do not slump when the damp days come. Long piles should be used for drapes which may be pulled over the different sets of windows. The cretomes will not look well after a few damp days and nights and so we recommend the mohairs which come in delightful stripes and figured designs. They are absolutely sun proof and look as crisp and fresh after twelve months hard wear as they do the day they are hung.

Query: We have a floor lamp which has a large shade finished with fringe around the bottom. If the fringe is removed the globe show. What can we do about it? Mrs. D.

Answer: Very large elaborate shades are no more and we recommend that you discard your old frame and buy a simple one about 16 or 18 inches lower diameter and make or have made a simple silk or parchment shade which is more in keeping with the modern trend of interior decorations. Fringe is never found now on the exclusive shades.

Query: Our living room has a very low ceiling. Shall we use a valance or not? Mrs. M. G.

Answer: By all means, no. A valance only accents the low ceiling and makes it seem lower than it is. Use a striped material and hang your draperies straight from the rods to the top of the baseboard.

Query: We wish to know what materials you would recommend for a living room and bedroom. Both are on the front of the house and it seems as though they should be curtained alike. Mrs. M. G. G.

Answer: You are correct, especially if the house is small and the bedroom opens out of the living room. Some times this is not necessary when the draperies are lined for then they may be made to appear the same from the outside while the interiors are quite different. Again we recommend the mohairs. The range is so extensive that you might use a figured pattern in the bed room and a plain material like the background in the living room. Or if the house is formal near the same for the outside by all means buy as good material as you can afford and be sure that it is sunfast, for there is no economy in cheap draperies and our southern Oregon climate is conceded to be the most severe of all sections of the U. S. on draperies.

## Helping the Homemaker

Sometimes I find new tasks await My slender strength, and yet, elate I welcome one and all. For I have learned each deed I do, Each friend I make, will let me through.

Record Potato Crop  
The world's record yield of potatoes, so far as is known, was raised by Zwickman Brothers, Stockton, Cal., in 1924. They produced 1,933.3 bushels on an acre.

Cut the dry stalks of phlox, erythranthums and similar plants and clean up all refuse in both the flower and vegetable garden. To be sure that this waste material will not harbor pests, burn it.

Stuffed Dates. Wipe dates with a damp cloth. Make a slit with a sharp knife on one side of each date and remove the pit. They may be refilled with any one of a variety of confections or a mixture of several. Put the filling in the date, press well together and roll in confectioners' sugar or granulated, in cocoanut, white or browned, or in chopped nuts.

Suggestions as fillings: Nutmeats, candied ginger, marshmallows, candied cherries, strips of citron, seeded raisins or peanut butter. Prunes or figs may be used in place of dates.

You needn't bother to forgive your enemies—just forget them. A retentive memory may be a good thing, but the ability to forget is the true token of greatness.

Teaching Little Girls to Sew. Do you encourage your little girls to sew by giving them pretty scraps for doll-clothes, pin cushions or quilt-blocks? This certainly is not a waste of material. Allow them to use their imagination, for crea-

tive work is the best of all. At the same time, we can help them with the first principles of neatness in sewing, and a few of the simple stitches. This seems more like play than lessons; but, at the same time they are unconsciously really learning to sew.

If the crust on hot breads is baked too hard, grease and place in open window and it will soften. Candied Pineapple. 2 cups of sugar, green coloring, 1 cup water, pineapple slices.

Cook sugar and water until a thick syrup is formed, add coloring and drop into the syrup the drained slices of pineapple. Cook until very thick. Remove pineapple and sprinkle with granulated sugar. Use for garnish for baked ham.

When separating eggs if you drop a portion of yolk into whites, moisten a cloth with cold water, touch to yolk and it will adhere to it.

Green Peppers Stuffed with Cheese. Cut a thin slice from the stem-end of 7 green peppers and remove pit and seeds. Parboil for 2 minutes, drain and fill with the following mixture: 2 cups grated American cheese; 2 cups bread crumbs; 1 tsp. chopped onion; 3 tsp. butter and seasoning to taste. Sew the peppers in a baking dish; sprinkle with grated cheese and bake 20 minutes.

Colorful Bubbles. When rainy days come, start the children blowing bubbles and then color the water with vegetable coloring. Any gay vegetable coloring will do and they adore bright yellow, red and other cheerful bubbles.

When fruit juice runs out in an open or on top of stove, throw salt on it to prevent an odor.

sugar and cinnamon, using twice as much sugar as cinnamon. Soften the butter and spread on the slices of bread. Sprinkle well with the cinnamon. Roll, slice and toast as above.

Toasted Rolled Meat Sandwiches. Use any cooked lean meat such as chicken, beef, pork, ham or tongue. Put through the food chopper, moisten with mayonnaise and spread on the bread. Roll, slice and toast as above.

Neapolitan Rolled Sandwiches. Remove all crusts from a fresh loaf of bread and cut lengthwise. Spread with creamed butter. Then spread one end of each slice with pimiento cheese, the middle portion with cream cheese moistened if necessary with a little cream, and the remaining third of the slice with cream cheese colored with a little green paste or spinach juice. Roll from end to end like a jelly roll, fasten with toothpicks, slice and toast as above.

This recipe may be varied by substituting minced ham, a mixture of chopped hard-boiled egg moistened with mayonnaise, and a mixture of softened American cheese for the soft-colored cream cheese.

## Guiding Your Child

Parents want their children to do them credit. They want to be proud of their manners, their speech, their school reports, their perfect obediences.

One may question whether this passion for perfection does not more often sow parental pride than the best interests of the child. The irreproachable behavior we are in the habit of commending is not necessarily an indication that all is well in the child's soul.

Are the polite manners grounded in genuine consideration of the rights of others? Has correct speech been attained at the cost of suppressing the child's own graphic if less refined expression? Is the good school report a by-product of real interest and an awakened intellect or has he learned his lessons under the pressure of anxiety, and the threat of disapproval? Is the obedience so much admired by visitors the result of the fear of punishment or is it a sign of the growth of self control and a sense of social responsibility?

These are questions which the mothers of model children might well ask themselves. The parent who achieves outward conformity in her child must be sure that this pleasant state of affairs is really a sign of his inner growth.

The child who has been coerced into compliance either has had his spirit broken or has learned to hide a sullen and rebellious heart beneath his pretty manners. The spirit crushed in childhood will be sorely needed later on when he tries to establish himself in a competitive world. The sullen and rebellious heart will find ugly manifestations in the selfish and irritable adult.

Parents would be wiser to evaluate their pride and accept imperfect performance in their children. The child who makes real effort in the right direction and has his heart in the right place is laying the soundest foundation for good character.

## Solving the Table Service Problem

The young housewife and hostess often wonders just what type of service should be used in serving dinner, especially when it is a company occasion. There is one safe and sane rule which always works, and that is: Do the way that can be done easily. There are three recognized types of table service and each one has its place.

The Russian service is entirely formal. All the courses are served from the side. The food is offered to the guest or placed before him on a plate. Russian service can only be practiced successfully when there are trained servants to serve the meal.

The English service is formal, but it has a gracious hospitality which is charming. All the food is served by the host or hostess or both. The host serves and serves the meat and vegetables; the hostess serves the salad, dessert and coffee.

The Compromise service or a combination of the Russian and English services is the one used in most homes today. There is less tedious delay between courses and it gives a genial atmosphere to both the host and hostess serving the family and their guests, also the waitress is at hand to pass the plates.

## NEED COLLARS AND CUFFS?



Pretty collar and cuff sets never go out of fashion. They are the finishing touch on every tailored or straight-line dress. One should have at least two sets for each frock of this type. The business girl and the woman who travels a great deal especially will appreciate the smart appearance which simply slipping on a fresh, crisp set will afford. In children's clothes, too, dainty collars and cuffs set off their little frocks and romper suits to good advantage.

There is no reason why one should not have an abundant supply of these useful and attractive accessories since they can be made at slight cost and very little work. For school, street and house dresses, in fact for all but the finest dresses calling for crepe de chine or sheer lawn, these sets can be made out of the soft, creamy material to be found in a used flour bag. They are lined with light weight longcloth or muslin.

The bags may be had from a bakery for a few cents each and one bag will make several sets.

The stamping is taken out by covering the lumpy places with lard or kerosene over night and then washing them out in lukewarm water.

The sets may be trimmed in a variety of ways. For children's garments, colored bias tape binding is a sturdy yet attractive finish. For street frocks, the collar and cuffs may be buttonholed, with a little cross-stitch motif in each corner, or edged with some coarse inexpensive lace, such as terechon or Chinese lace, and tiny medallions inserted.

Another effective style is the narrow, circular collar shown here which has no trimming at all, simply a pearl button at the back closing. The cuffs to go with this collar button together like a man's shirt sleeves. The advantage of this style is that they do not need to be sewn on each time and are changed in a jiffy.

The neck bindings are made out of the linen muslin, cut on the true bias, or of inch-wide bias tape which comes already folded.

## Humane Society

How the Birds Help the Farmer

It has been found that the following birds are especially good friends to the farmer, who should protect them in every possible way: Phoebe, Kingbird, catbird, swallow, brown thrasher, rose-breasted cock, house wren, vireo, cuckoo, oriole, the various native sparrows, warblers, shore lark, loggerhead shrike and meadow lark. The crow, raven, blackbird, and cedar bird do more harm than harm. The red-headed and nuthatch woodpeckers may be injurious or beneficial according to circumstances, but all the rest of the woodpeckers are very helpful.

Only three kinds of hawks seem to be guilty of the charges made against them, the goose-hawk, Cooper's and the sharp-shinned, while all the rest are very helpful to the farmer and fruitgrower.

The bluebird is a good friend, destroying harmful insects. The robin eats little caterpillars, but less than five per cent. Nearly half his food consists of wasps, ants, spiders, grasshoppers, caterpillars, etc. He destroys the March fly larvae which injure the grass in the hay fields.

The chickadee will in one day destroy 1500 eggs of the canker worm moth.

The snowflakes not only are the greatest fly catchers, but also destroy flying ants, beetles, and weevils.

Hawks and owls are among the best friends of the farmer. Barn owl lives mostly on injurious mammals, gophers, moles, mice, rats, etc. The greater part of its food consists of poultry and game—feeds mostly on injurious insects and mammals.

The red-headed woodpecker eats more grasshoppers than any other woodpecker; also eats June bugs, weevils, etc.

The meadow lark is said to eat clover seed, but that seems to be a mistake, for 50 percent of his food at clover time was found to be insects, mostly grasshoppers.

The quail. The farmer's best friend. Weed seeds constitute almost his entire food.

There are many other birds not mentioned in this list, which are great insect destroyers. All birds should be protected and not destroyed.
