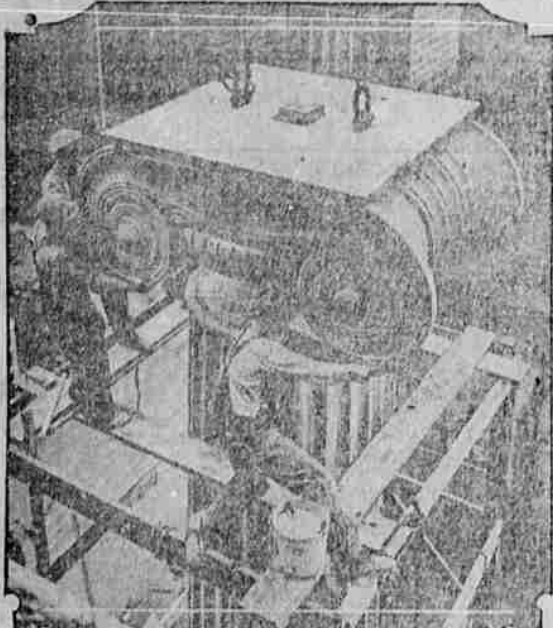

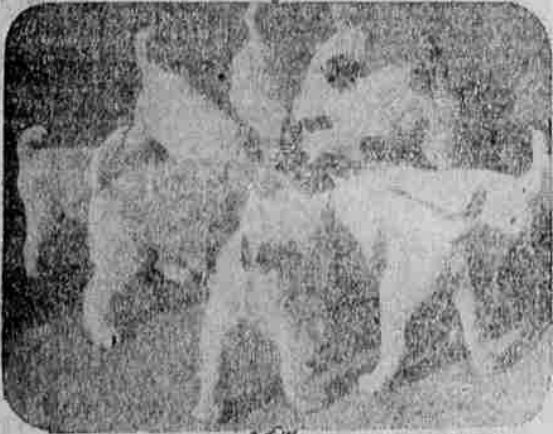

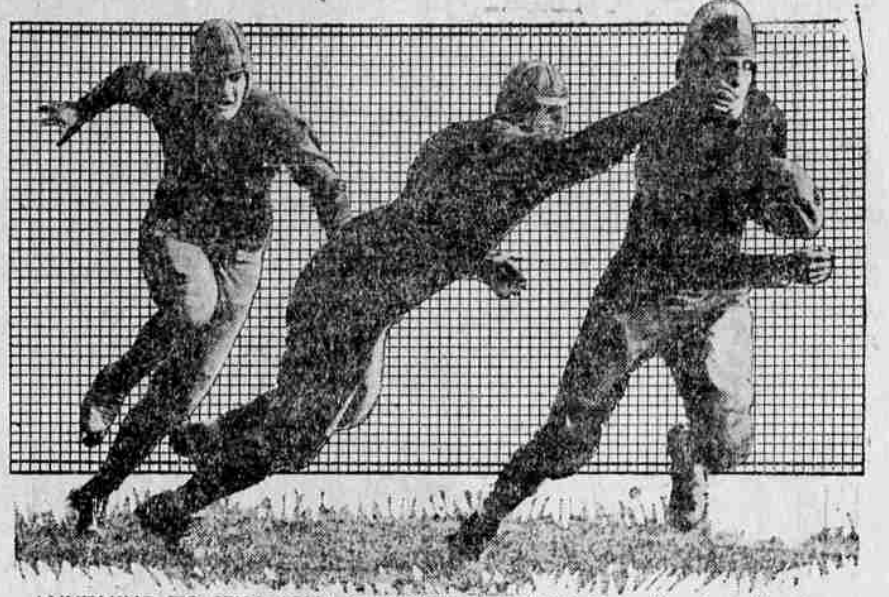

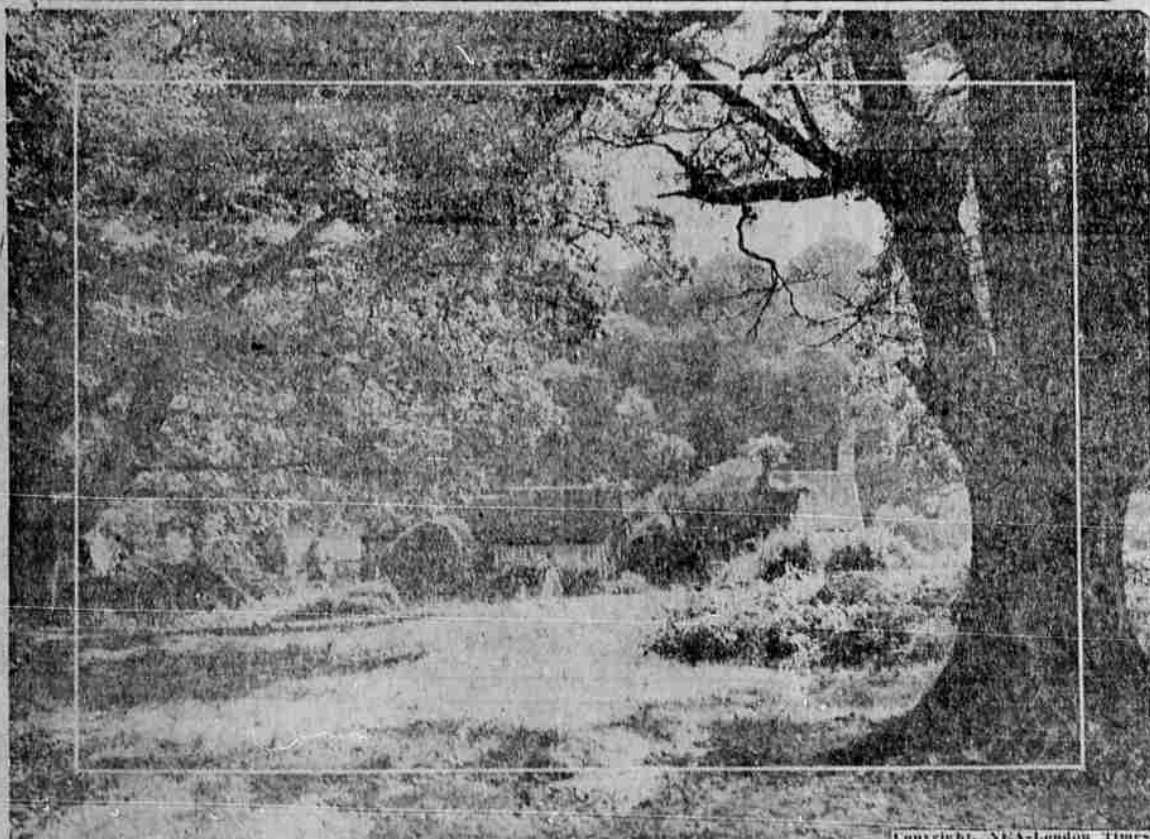
GOLDEN CROWN on his head, the new King of Cambodia dresses in his resplendent regalia and poses for his picture in his imperial palace at Phnom Penh.
