

TURKEY RECEIPTS PORTLAND MARKET LARGE YESTERDAY

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 21.—(AP) Turkey receipts of yesterday were the largest of the season. The demand was heavy to offset the plentiful supply. No. 1 grade dressed turkey averaged 35 cents a pound with other quotations unchanged. Cranberries, walnuts, almonds and pumpkins, which comprise the remaining substance of holiday dinners were steady, with no general changes in price. Recent cold nights have had their effect on the cauliflower crop. Cauliflower is now selling on the retail market at 5 to 25 cents a head. Much cauliflower was reported injured in the fields. No damage was reported to celery although the price was higher ranging from 1 to 1 1/2 cents a bunch on the retail market. Dairy market quotations remain unchanged today with the exception of undersized eggs which rose one cent in keeping with the general gains in other classes yesterday. Egg prices now range from standard extras at 31 to undersized at 29 cents.

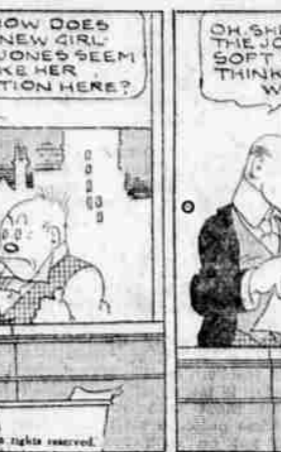

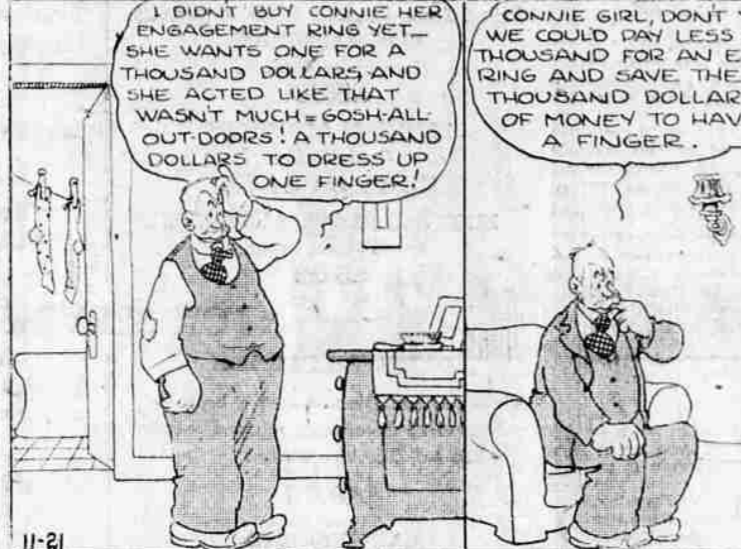

MENINGITIS GAINS ON PACIFIC COAST

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21.—(AP) An unusual prevalence of cerebrospinal meningitis in the country during the past year, particularly on the Pacific coast, was shown in a report issued by the public health service. Cases totaled 176, more than double the maximum reached at any time during the past four years. No reason was advanced for the increase. The typhoid maximum was lower than at any time during the past two years, totalling about 1,000 cases as compared with 1,600 in the 1925 maximum. Infantile paralysis cases showed the usual summer increase in 1928, but the high point reached was only 329 cases, one-half last year's maximum.

Government Resigns MELBOURNE, Victoria, Nov. 21.—(AP) The labor government of Victoria, under Premier E. J. Hogan, has resigned. Sir William McPherson, former state treasurer, today accepted a mandate to form a new ministry.
