SHORT TERM RACE VOTE CANVASSED

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 22.—(AP) The majority vote received by Robert R. Butler of the Dullies over ex-Governor Walter M. Pierce in the congressional short term race was 5902, according to an official canvass of the vote by Secretary of State Hoss. Butler, the Republican candidate to fill the unexpired term of Congressman N. J. Sinton, ending March 4 next, received 30,468 votes and Pierce, Democrat, received 24,568. Butler carried all counties in the district except Morrow, Union and Wallowa.

Hoover's lead over Smith in Oregon's presidential vote cast November 6 was 90,118, according to official figures from all counties. The vote for Hoover was 295,341, for Smith 199,223, Thomas 2729, for Reynolds 1564 and for Foster 1094.

The expense account of Harry D. Norton of Grants Pass, Democrat, in his successful campaign for election as circuit judge in this district, filed with the state department at Salem this week, was \$250. This is in addition to the \$2950 spent during the campaign by the "Better Government League" in behalf of Mr. Norton, and which expense account was also filed at Salem this week.
