SCOUTMASTERS MEET TO ORGANIZE GROUP FOR SCOUT LEADERS

The scoutmasters of the Medford district of the Crater Lake council met at dinner at the Hotel Holland Thursday night for the purpose of organizing a scout leaders' group. It is planned to hold these meetings monthly.

In addition to the regular business of the meeting, the session of the scoutmasters' training school for the week was combined with the dinner program. The scout executive gave a talk on scoutmaster-ship, emphasizing the importance of weekly, monthly and yearly programs planned in advance in conference with the patrol leaders and troop staff.

The importance of the job of being a scoutmaster was stressed by Mr. Bricker. He stated that the caliber of the men coming into leadership of the troops and boys is constantly growing; that the Crater Lake council was no exception and that they were rallying business and professional leaders with executive ability and real character to lead the local boys.

The purpose of the Association of Scoutmasters is as follows: An association to unite the Boy Scout leaders at regular intervals; in order that new ideas may be propounded; experiences exchanged, and a healthy feeling of rivalry be developed among the troops of the council; socially to acquaint the men engaged in the same common work.

All registered scout masters, assistant scoutmasters, junior scoutmasters, committeemen and members of the Crater Lake council may become members of this organization.

In the compilation of the cost for each high school district of Jackson county in educating each high school pupil of the district, the Butte Falls district has the largest per capita cost, \$3.87; Ashland has the lowest with \$2.3 cents, and Medford the next lowest with 25.5 cents.

There is a wide variation of per capita cost in the various districts in educating each high school pupil, caused by the varied number of pupils and the improvements made by each district. Of course, the less the number of pupils the larger the per capita cost.
