

KING GEORGE MAINTAINING IMPROVEMENT

LONDON, Nov. 24.—(AP) An official bulletin on King George's condition late this afternoon stated that his majesty had maintained the improvement noted this morning, his condition remaining the same.

"The king is very much better," said Queen Mary to Dame Ethel Smith, a widely known woman composer with whom she chatted this afternoon at a concert by the Royal Choral society in Albert Hall. The queen looked rather tired but her men bore no evidence of worry when she left Buckingham palace to go to the concert.

DAKES-SALAAAM, Tanganyika Territory, Africa, Nov. 24.—(AP) The Prince of Wales at present is on a shooting expedition in the Doroda district two days distance from Dodoma. Apparently his plans here have been changed by the illness of his father, King George. He expects to leave Kiloma for Abercorn, northern Rhodesia, next Thursday or Friday.

The Duke of Gloucester is shooting in the vicinity of Lake Rukwa and is making for the Chimbesi river, a tributary of the Zambezi river. He expects to meet his older brother at Livingstonia, northern Rhodesia.
