Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, Nov. 26.—(AP)—The "bull" market roared along at a brisk pace today, stopping only temporarily to absorb a large volume of selling which followed the marking up of the call money rate from 6 1/2 to 7 per cent. Extreme gains in the active high priced issues ran from \$5 to nearly \$20 a share. Mounting call money rates did not diminish speculative demand in the final hour, when a number of issues touched new high figures. The nation-wide disposition to buy rendered it easy for pools to get an immediate following as soon as they began to accumulate individual shares. Midland Steel products preferred rose 15 points to 295; National Biscuit 9 points to 194 1/2; Davidson Chemical, 8 to 64 1/2; and Goodyear Rubber 8 to 102 1/2—all new peak prices. The closing was strong. Sales approximated 5,600,000 shares.

The Noted Dead

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 26.—(AP)—The board of trustees of the South-west museum, which was founded by Dr. Charles Fletcher Lummis, who died here yesterday, will be in charge of the funeral Wednesday. It was announced today. Dr. Lummis, author, poet, explorer and foremost historian of the southwest, died of cancer in his 69th year. During his career he had served as the first city editor of the Los Angeles Times and public librarian of Los Angeles. He was the founder of the Landmarks Club, an expert on Indian language and customs, and one of America's foremost archaeologists. For his research work in Spanish American history Dr. Lummis was knighted by the king of Spain in 1915. BERLIN, Nov. 26.—(AP)—Admiral Helfrich Scherer, who directed the German fleet at the battle of Jutland, on May 31, 1916, against a superior English fleet, died today at the age of 62. His death occurred as he was traveling from Dresden to Mannheim. Promoted to the chief of command of the imperial German fleet, in February, 1918, Admiral Scherer conducted the historic bat-
