

IMPRESSIVE THANKSGIVING TILTS LISTED

South Has Many Teams in Action — Oregon Aggies Travel Greatest Distance — Huskies Meet Washington State in West.

NEW YORK. — (AP) — Football games which have grown with the years into institutions will feature the Thanksgiving program. The Thursday engagements do not reach the total of some busy autumn Saturdays, but no single Saturday has offered the number of traditional contests.

In the east, Cornell and Pennsylvania look back over the years to 1853 when the series between the two eleven's started. The rivals have met 34 times with the war year of 1918 furnishing the only interruption.

Moving south, Vanderbilt and the University of the South (Sevanee) are still carrying on a football feud started in 1891, with but one lapse — 1899. Virginia and North Carolina started their gridiron warfare in 1892, and 32 games have been made a matter of record. Virginia Military Institute and Virginia Polytechnic Institute have clashed 25 times since 1894. There are other games in Dixie where the rivalry has just begun, only a dozen or so games having been played.

Penn State and Pittsburgh furnish a scintillating Pennsylvania battle that has waged back and forth since 1894 with 24 engagements already fought.

Decision Sought.

West Virginia and Washington & Jefferson have played steadily since 1919, and Brown and Colgate have not missed an annual bout in nine years. Brown and Colgate are wondering when they will be able to reach a decision, as three ties in a row have been revised off, resulting in scores of 14 to 14, 14 to 16 and 6 to 6.

Columbia and Syracuse have been playing only seven years, but in that time Columbia has won only one game and tied one.

The traveling award for the day will go to the Oregon Aggies, who ride all the way to New York to meet New York university. Another team with wanderlust will be Lombard traveling to Shreveport, La., to play Centenary. Maryland and Johns Hopkins will meet at Baltimore with a thought of a stirring contest last year when Johns Hopkins won 14 to 13.

Mid-West Games.

The mid-west does not play Thanksgiving football with the east.

chiasm of the south and east, but a few games stand out. No one is likely to pick the scene of the Oklahoma-Missouri game, which happens to be Norman, for a pink tie, and there will be plenty of action when Nebraska charges into the Kansas Aggies. Iowa, State and Marquette will play, as will Drake and Creighton.

Southern football fans will have a confusion of riches. Alabama and Georgia should put on a good show at Birmingham, and Georgia Tech and Alabama Poly (Auburn) will play as usual at Atlanta. Washington and Lee will go to Jacksonville to meet the undefeated Alligators of Florida.

Louisiana and all its bayous will get excited over the game between Tulane and Louisiana State university. L. S. U. has escaped defeat in the Southern conference and lost only one game outside — to the Arkansas Razorbacks — so Tulane will forget losses to Georgia Tech, Vanderbilt and Georgia if the Green can stop the rush of the Tigers.

Other state struggles command attention. The Mississippi Aggies and the University of Mississippi ("Ole Miss") will fight it out, the University of Texas and the Texas Aggies mix, and Southern Methodist and Texas Christian university

add to the tenseness in Texas. Duke plays Davidson in North Carolina. Clemson may win a South Carolina championship by beating Furman.

State lines separate the University of South Carolina and North Carolina State, but the fight should be no less spirited. Three family affairs in the far west will introduce the University of Washington to Washington State, Colorado College to the Colorado Aggies and Utah university to the Utah Aggies.

IOWA CITY, Ia., Nov. 28. — (AP) — The University of Iowa football team was awarded the title of Western conference champions yesterday under the rating system devised by the University of Illinois. Although Illinois won the championship on a percentage basis, Prof. Dickinson explained that Illinois played the team which finished higher than fifth in the Big Ten standings. Iowa, he said, was entitled to championship recognition by virtue of its record against first division opponents.

In presenting the Jack Bissman trophy to the Iowa, Prof. Dickinson said no team should claim a football championship until it had demonstrated "it was better than the rest."

LOWLY BRUIN IN UGLY MOOD FOR WEBFOOT GAME

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 28. — (AP) — The Bruins of the University of California at Los Angeles might be defeat-groggy, having been trounced by every Pacific coast conference foe this season, but Oregon University's footballers, en route here for a Thanksgiving day tussle, are apt to find them in a mood that bodes little good.

The Bruins, playing their last game of the season, are short-handed in the turkey day clash, but the way they are going about their workouts indicates that they are preparing to give the webfooters the battle of their lives.

Long and grueling practice sessions have been the share of the Bruins this week, and if they show the fight they have displayed in their drills when up against Oregon, a battle is in prospect.

The webfooters are due here this morning.
