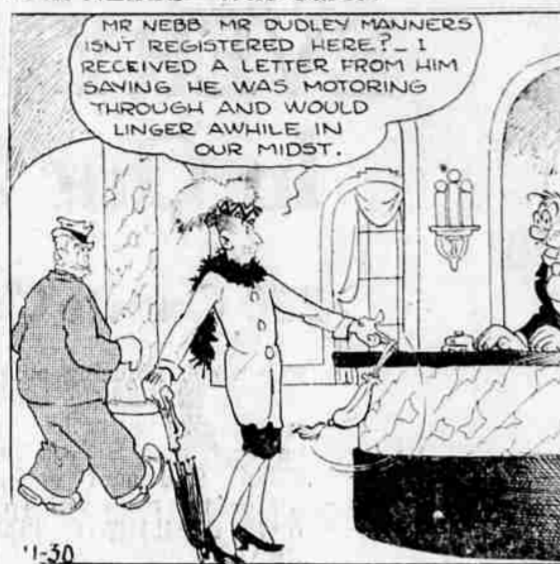
Springfield Vermont, has undertaken a comprehensive program for the improvement of its airport. The Springfield post was the first municipal venture of its kind in the Green Mountain state.
