ATHLETIC underwear of a new type is exhibited here by Colette Merton, Hollywood actress, who pauses in the midst of a tennis game to pose for the camera.



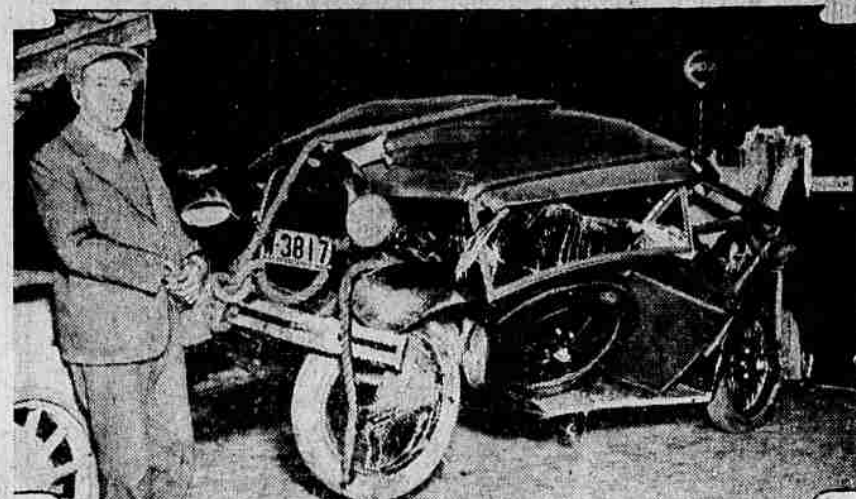

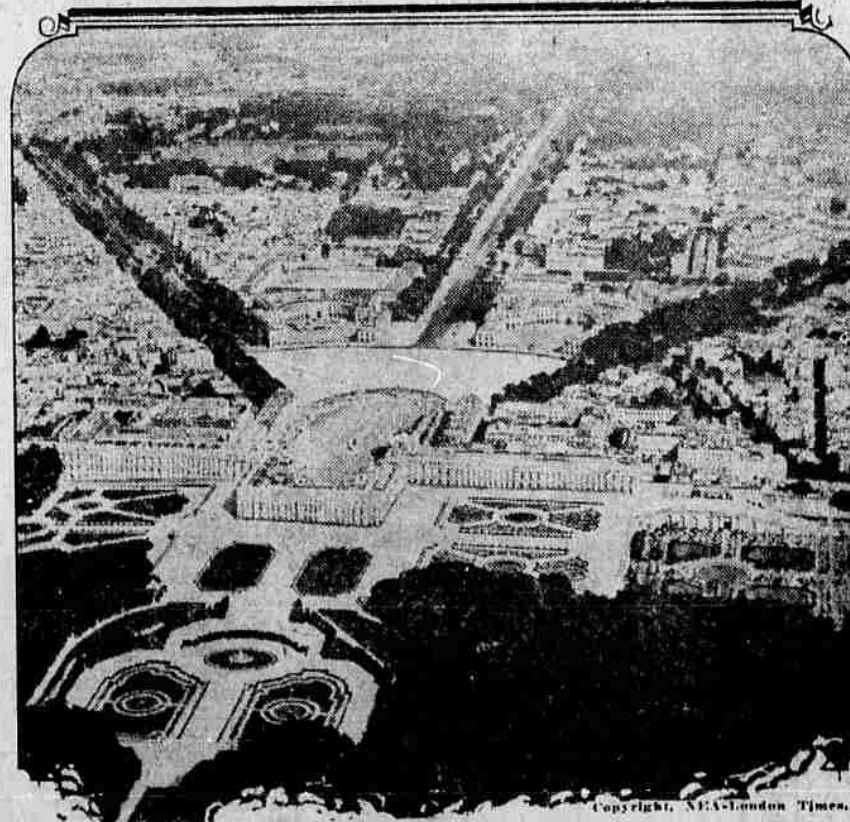

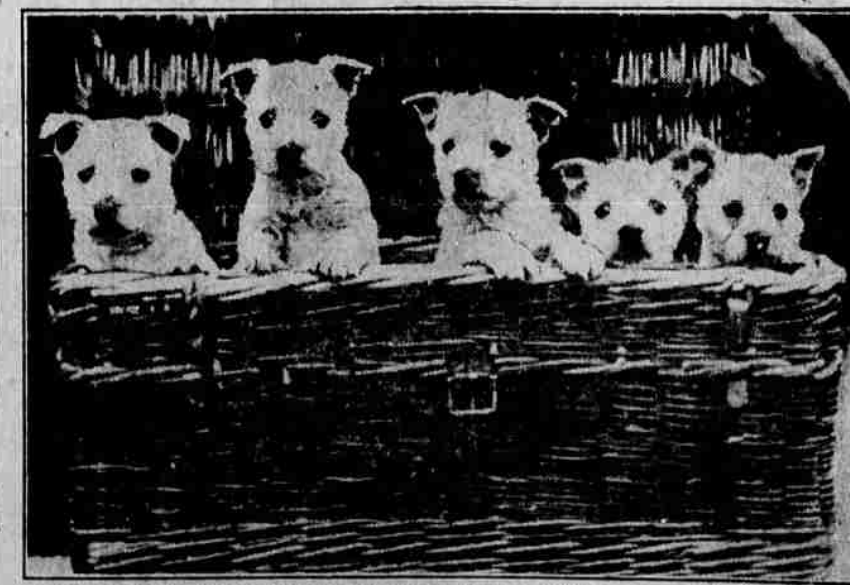
