

TURKEY GROWERS RECEIVE BETTER AVERAGE PRICES

As near as can be ascertained turkey growers of the Rogue River valley are receiving a slightly better than average price for their fowls, and much better than many districts of the Northwest. The prices vary some, Washington district receiving but 25 cents per pound, and Vale, Ore., growers in the million dollar Idaho pool, receiving 42 1/2 cents per pound. The Idaho pool dominates the market, to a large extent in the Rocky mountain states, and the Dakotas.

Valley growers received for their Thanksgiving shipments to New York markets about 37 1/2 cents, which is less than the Idaho pool, and more than the Umpqua pool. The local prices have ranged from 30 cents per pound for No. 1 turkeys to 35 cents, the price depending on the supply in the big markets and the needs of the buyers.

The turkey demand reaches its high point during the Thanksgiving season, with a generally firm but not brisk demand during the Christmas and New Year seasons. Turkey for the five carload shipment for New York, to be dispatched from this city by the Farm Bureau and Poultry association have commenced to come in, and are expected to increase daily. The final date for the receipt is December 12, assuring their arrival in New York in time for the Christmas trade.

NEW YORK, Dec. 4.—(AP)—A brisk rally in stock market prices, which ended a long line of losses up to 4 points and a few specialties up to 21 points, was checked this afternoon by a return of the 10 percent call money rate. Early gains were reduced and several representative shares, such as General Motors, U. S. Steel, Commonwealth and Hudson Motors, were carried below last night's final quotations.
Gold, Dust, Wesson Oil and Standard Milling all broke into new high ground in the late trading, on reports that negotiations are under way for a merger of the three. Radio shot up to a new record price at 408, an extreme rise of 34 points. A. M. Byers went ahead 6 points to a new peak, while Willard Steel and Chrysler jumped 7 and 4 points respectively. The close was irregular. Total sales approximated 4,000,000 shares.
