Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, Dec. 7.—(AP)—The stock market, which was shaken to its foundations yesterday when a heavy selling movement carried prices down 100 issues down 25 to 22.50 a share, looks sharply at the opening today and then rallied in brisk fashion as the "bull" forces hastily created their supports for the speculative favorites. Early declines of \$3 to \$15 a share were cut down or wiped out and by midday more than a score issues had been listed \$2 to \$5 a share above yesterday's closing prices.

Organization Formed

Representing the three southern Oregon counties and Del Norte county a temporary organization was formed at the close of the meeting and was scheduled to meet today. H. R. Baker of Medford secretary, with the following representing their respective districts: West Daley, Judge Childs and Ira Scott, Del Norte county; Sam Baker, W. Demmer and Isaac Best, Grants Pass; C. E. Gates, Mayor O. O. Alenderfer and Prof. Irving Mining of Ashland, Jackson county; William L. Walter West and P. R. Goddard, Klamath county. County judges of each county were also included in the temporary committee.

With an organization behind it the project would have more opportunity of meeting the approval of government funds which would recognize the power of sponsoring the work. The same views were also held by James Owen of the Owen-Owson Lumber company, a former Crescent City resident, who years ago worked for the harbor construction.
