The whistle was found by L. J. Simpson where it had been stored away in a workshop. With Mr. Simpson, president of the Simpson Lumber company, at the main switch, workmen sent the first fir log through the saws.

**MUST CEASE LIQUOR SALES TO INDIANS**

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 13.—(AP) "Sale of moonshine on Klamath Indian reservation must stop!" This declaration was made by Assistant United States District Attorney Francis Marsh in federal district court Wednesday when Max Landauri, Mexican laborer, pleaded guilty to eight counts of an indictment charging sale of liquor to Klamath Indians.

Federal Judge McNary sentenced Landauri to 12 months in McNeil's Island. Landauri is the second Mexican to enter a plea of guilty to charges of selling liquor on the Klamath reservation within the last week.

VANCOUVER, B. C., Dec. 13.—(AP)—Capt. J. Gillen of the B. & M., a 40-foot gas tug of Vancouver, was drowned and the vessel was wrecked near Sechart, Gulf of Georgia, late yesterday, when a backfire from the boat's engine caused an explosion.

**Blacksmith Discouraged**

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 13.—(AP)—Discouraged because of lack of work, William Higgins, Roseburg blacksmith, ended his life in a rooming house here yesterday by gas. Officers said he pawned some clothes to get money to put in the gas meter.
