## LASSMAN HAD TOO MANY BUMPS UPON HEAD DOCTOR SAYS

PITTSBURGH, Dec. 13.—(AP)—Al Lassman, New York University football captain, who has been in a hospital here since the Carnegie Tech game of November 17 with a head injury, seems to be suffering from a case of "repeated bumps."

"We have just learned," said his doctor today, "that Lassman spent almost every week end in a hospital recovering from head and neck injuries incurred in football. His present case seems to be an accumulation of these repeated bumps."

The statement added that he had suffered an impairment of functioning on his left side, but at no time could it be construed as paralysis.

"This condition is improving daily and he now has absolute use of his left side and arm," said the statement.

Lassman is entirely conscious, but, the doctor said: "As in all concussion cases, his memory as to the actual happenings is faulty. He doesn't recall the game which, to us, is perfectly natural."

His pulse and respiration are normal and there is no sign of a brain hemorrhage. Absolute rest is necessary for full recovery.

## WOMEN GOLFERS WILL HAVE NATIONAL OPEN TOURNEY IN CHICAGO

CHICAGO, Dec. 13.—(AP)—A golf tournament involving the first women's national open title will be held in Chicago next year, under the direction of the Women's Western Golf association.

The tournament will be similar to the men's national open—72 holes of medal play. Technically the championship will be the women's western medal play championship, which formerly has been decided over 54 holes; actually it will be as much a national championship as the national open.

The question of establishing an open championship for women has been discussed by the United States Golf association, which frowned upon the proposition until some organization had given the proposal a trial.

## BOB MEYERS WINS WITH AERIAL SPIN

PORTLAND Ore., Dec. 13.—(AP)—The wrestling season opened here last night when Bob Meyers, Tillamook, defeated Cleo Kauffman, Columbus, Ohio, in two out of three falls. Kauffman took the first fall in six minutes, 32 seconds with a reverse half-nelson crutch hold. Meyers won the second in 19 minutes 10 seconds with an airplane spin and the final fall in 14 seconds with another spin. Kauffman was so shaken up after the first aerial ride the final fall was a mere matter of routine. Kauffman weighed 174 and Meyers 172 pounds.

Walter Johnson and Frenchy Leavitt went 30 minutes to a draw in the preliminary.

## FOOTBALL STAR TAKES BRIDE TO COAST GAME

NEW YORK, Dec. 13.—(AP)—Ken Strong, New York university football star, and his bride, Amelia Hunneman, an actress, are taking a whole football team along on their honeymoon.

They were married at the little church around the corner a few hours before Strong was scheduled to leave for Pittsburg to join other members of the all-eastern football team, which is to play an all-star aggregation of western college players at San Francisco December 29.

They announced their engagement a week ago, but said at that time they would be married in June, after Ken had been graduated. Their marriage yesterday was a surprise, even to members of their immediate families.

## ALUMNUS WEEKLY SAYS GAME HURT BY SUBSTITUTIONS

NEW YORK, Dec. 13.—(AP)—The Alumnus weekly of New York university says that frequent substitutions have reduced football from a contest between two representative elevens to a test as to which of two institutions can produce the strongest aggregation of players. Many substitutions are made for tactical, not physical, reasons and are unnecessary.

N. Y. U. used 154 players in nine games, while its opponents used 148, an average of over 20 to the game for N. Y. U. and under 17 for the opposing teams. Only 29 New York players and 21 opponents played through a full game.

Giving as an example the Army-Navy game, in which one player was in for one play, the weekly says that the substitutions are "a matter of tactics" and "as for strategy, the coach runs the team during the game as well as before and after."

## PORTLAND PITCHER SOLD TO PIRATES

PITTSBURGH, Dec. 13.—(AP)—The Pittsburgh National league baseball club has obtained Lawrence French, lefthanded pitcher, from the Portland club of the Pacific coast league, according to Sam Dreyfus, Pirate treasurer. In exchange for French, the Pirates gave Portland infielder Mack Hillis, of the South Atlantic league, a pitcher to be delivered later, and cash, the amount of which was not announced.

FREMONT, O., Dec. 13.—(AP)—A right to the chin just as the second round opened sent "Big Jim" Sigman, Barborton heavy-weight through the ropes and gave George Godfrey, mammoth negro of Leipersville, Pa., a knock-out here last night. Sigman was unconscious for five minutes. The bout was scheduled for 10 rounds. Godfrey weighed 243 pounds and Sigman 210.

"I expect Yale to come through in fine shape next year," he says. Harvard is satisfied with the work of Coach Arnold Howson, in Barrett's opinion, despite numerous "unjust" criticisms against him by the alumni and the public.

Caldwell Tries Hockey. PROVIDENCE, R. I., Dec. 13.—(AP)—Bruce Caldwell, who was a football star at Yale, has decided to try professional hockey. He has agreed to come to Providence for a tryout. The local management believes he has the makings of another Myles Lane, and if he makes good he will be offered a contract.

Reforestation Fostered. RALEIGH, N. C. (AP)—To aid farmers in reforestation of areas not providing natural forest growth, the state has 350,000 pine seedlings, grown at a state nursery, for distribution next spring.

Orlando, Fla., new municipal airport is one of the most recent ventures undertaken in the south. The airport is located two miles east of the business district on the north bank of Lake Underhill and has an area of 65 acres.

The increase in trans-continental air service through Amarillo, Tex., has spurred municipal officials to the immediate establishment of an airport. Work is already under way, with a preliminary survey completed.

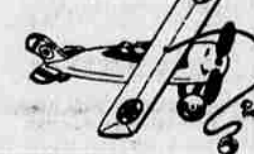

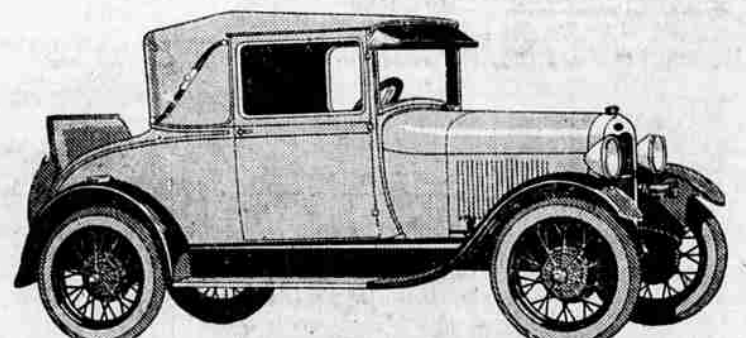
