Scientific Notes

SCIENTISTS FORCED TO BED BY GERMS THAT HE STUDIED

WASHINGTON, D. C., (P.)—Down with undulant fever, put out of action perhaps for the next two to five years, Dr. Edward Francis is on the casualty list of the army of science for the second time in his distinguished career of 28 years as a public health service research worker.

As in the former instance, when he suffered three months with "rabbit fever" about 12 years ago, the germs on which he was working overcame him soon after he had begun his laboratory attack against them.

His subsequent success in discovering, single-handed, the origin of this deadly in rabbits and similar animals and their parasites, has brought him international fame. He called it tularemia but it is coming to be known as "Francis disease."

He began work on undulant fever, also known as Malta fever, only a few months ago, taking up the health service's 16-year old investigation of this extremely disabling disease at the point where progress made by three other workers had been stopped by its ravages. His illness is expected to interfere seriously with work he was doing to develop a serum for prevention or cure of tularemia.

For him, illness means idleness as well as physical suffering, and idleness is something he has always found it hard to bear. A bachelor, 54 years old, his work

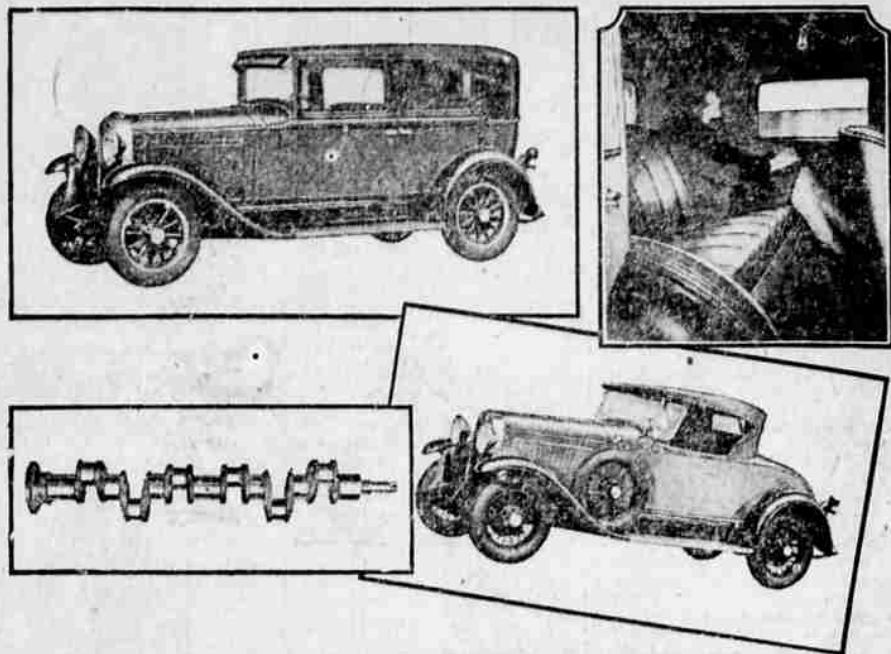

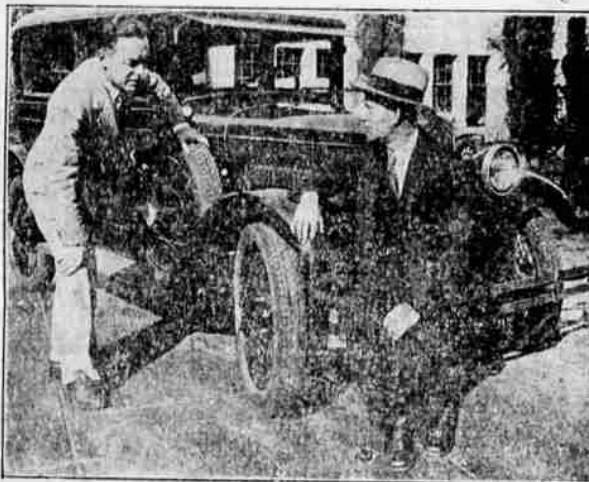

The railroad scenes were filmed in and near Truckee, California, located in the high Sierras, said to be the highest railroad junction in the United States.

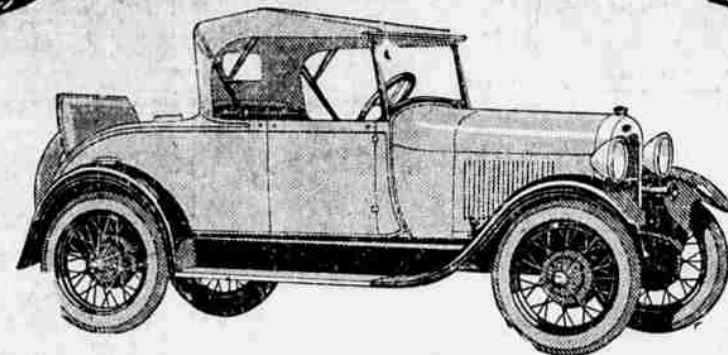

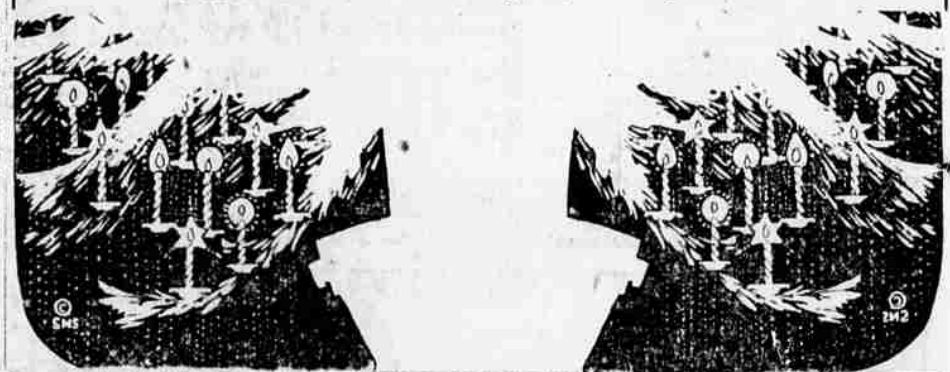
