Pruning demonstrations under auspices of the county agents office are to be held in various parts of the valley so that all fruit growers can easily attend. As announced by County Agent L. W. Wilcox, the schedule of time and places of such meetings is as follows:

December 19, Wednesday, 2 p. m.—Thornton Wiley orchard, Ashland.

December 20, Thursday, 9:30 a. m.—Carl Glasgow orchard, one mile east of Talent.

December 20, Thursday, 2 p. m.—Clancy orchard, three miles west of Medford on Jacksonville road.

December 21, Friday, 9:30 a. m.—Don Clark orchard, three-quarters miles east Crater Lake highway, Central Point road junction.

December 21, Friday, 2 p. m.—Frank Eaton orchard, east of Bear Creek on the bottom, three miles north of Central Point.

Prof. C. L. Long of the Oregon State Agricultural college will be present and demonstrate the latest ideas relative to pruning practices.

All growers are urged to avail themselves of this opportunity to discuss their pruning problems.
