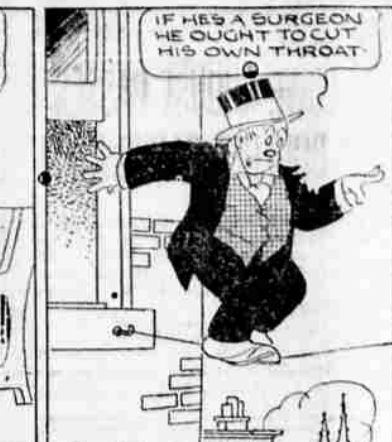
COOS BAY COUNTRY IS HELD IN WINTRY GRIP
