

EXPECT TO SUBMIT HOLIDAY PARCEL LIST OF JURORS FLOOD CROWDING MIDDLE JANUARY INTO POSTOFFICE

It is not likely that the jury list for the coming year will be completed by the county clerk's office for submission to the county court for final approval, much before the middle of January.

The clerk's office is now pruning from the list of names committee, all who have served upon a jury within the last two years, as they are exempt. The list when completed, will consist of about 800 names.

The next term of the circuit court is scheduled for the third Monday in February, with Judge-elect H. D. Norton of Grants Pass upon the bench, and Prosecutor-elect George A. Coddling, appearing for the state. To date, most of the matters scheduled, are civil and equity cases. Routine court matters are being handled daily by Judge Thomas.

The new officers will be sworn into office Monday, January 7. The newly elected officials are Circuit Judge H. D. Norton and Prosecutor George A. Coddling. The re-elected officials are County Clerk Delilah Stevens Meyers, Sheriff Ralph Jennings, School Superintendent Susanne Homes Carter, Commissioner Victor Bursell, and Assessor J. B. Coleman and Treasurer A. C. Walker, who were elected without opposition. County Judge Alex Sparrow, who is filling out by appointment, the term of the late W. J. Hartzog, and was also elected without opposition, will also be sworn in.

It has been noted at the Medford postoffice since the Christmas mail started that parcels are being sent out insured by Medford people in greater volume than ever before.

COUNTY OFFICIALS RETURNED TODAY FROM PORTLAND

County officials in attendance at state conventions at Portland this week returned this morning with the exception of Assessor J. B. Coleman, a member of the tax commission still in session. They were County Judge Alex Sparrow, Commissioners Victor Bursell and George Alford, and County Clerk Delilah Stevens Meyer.

Judge Sparrow, immediately after his return started to function and married a couple from Yreka, Calif., after hearing reports on juvenile delinquency, and a widow whose pension is apt to be discontinued.

"The county judges had a fine convention, as conventions go," said Judge Sparrow, "and I found out that Jackson county, in comparison with other counties of the state has no troubles at all. From what I heard, I would guess that every county in the state is worse off than Jackson county. They all had a hard luck story to tell."

Welfare workers of the county reported to Judge Sparrow on the status of a number of local needy cases.
