

MONEY SQUEEZE
FEAR BRINGS ON
SALE MOVEMENT

NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—(AP)—Heavy week-end profit-taking and sporadic bear selling turned the course of stock prices irregular today after an early outbreak of some bearishness in the selling is believed to have been inspired by fears of a "money squeeze" next week when corporations and banks withdraw large sums from the market in connection with year-end settlements.

Except for a couple of favorable dividend announcements, C. S. and cheerful reports of holiday trade, news was little in the day's business news to influence the price movement. Schulte Retail Stores was hammered down to a new low on unfavorable dividend rumors, but interests close to the company insist that the dividend will be paid.
