

SCORE OF ISSUES REACH NEW PRICE IN HEAVY BUYING

NEW YORK, Dec. 29.—(AP) Constructive forces were again at work in today's stock market, and prices moved upward in brisk fashion under rather heavy buying for both accounts.

Weight Aeronautical returned to the leadership of the market by soaring 12 points. National Tea moved up 14. Midland Steel Products 10. 7 and Peck Marquette six. Houston Oil, which was hammered down to 79 in the early December break, rallied nearly 6 points to 109.

COLD STORAGE EGGS PLAYING HAVOC WITH DECEMBER DELIVERY

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 29.—(AP) "Humpty Dumpty" is being played in eastern markets on December delivery of eggs, with the result of wide fluctuations in local offerings reflecting market price changes.

December eggs have tumbled 9 cents a dozen at Chicago in the last week. Today's Portland dairy exchange had fresh standard extras at a new low level of 36 cents.

Hogs compared with a week ago mostly 25 cents higher; closed strong at the advance; bulk light butchers \$9.50; scattering hogs Monday and some small lots driven Friday at \$9.50 and \$9.65; overweight and underweight \$9.25 down; extreme hogs down to \$8; rough packing \$8.75 to \$7; smooths up to \$7.75; slaughter pigs mostly \$8 to \$8.50; feeder pigs Monday mostly \$7.75, now in strong demand at \$8.

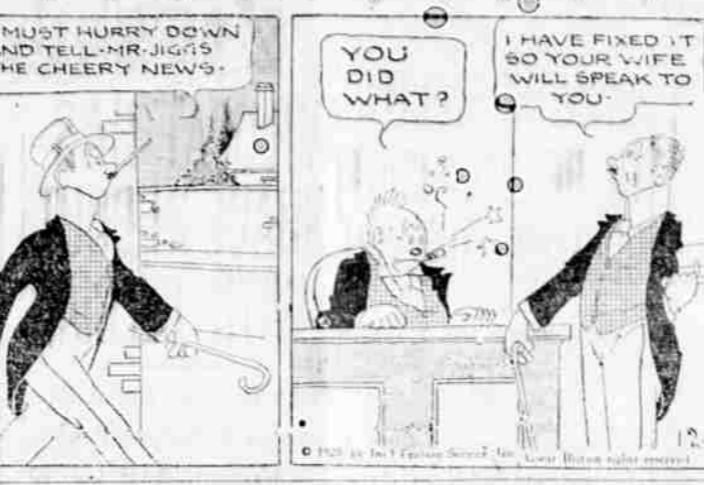

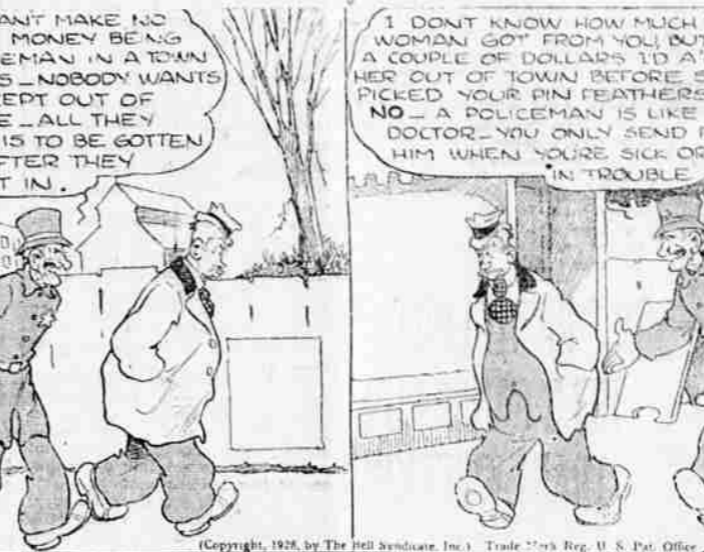
