

EMPIRE STATE TO INAUGURATE ITS 2ND ROOSEVELT

ALBANY, N. Y.—(AP) For the second time, a Roosevelt is to take the oath of office as governor of New York.

Once again the historic capital, looking down from its 150-foot elevation above this old Dutch city will act as a magnet to draw thousands from all parts of the Empire State and surrounding territory for the inaugural ceremony.

Already the clamor for tickets to the assembly chamber where the ceremony will be held, has begun, but Robert M. Exall, secretary of state and ex-official master of ceremonies for the occasion, is deaf to entreaties of all but the 1500 carefully selected fortunate ones who are to be admitted.

Once again, for 24 hours, Albany long familiar with state functions, will lay aside its cloak of casual interest and will take on a feverish excitement which will reach its climax only when Franklin Delano Roosevelt, fifth cousin of the late President Roosevelt, takes the oath of office.

The anticipation already is making itself felt throughout the city, and hotels are flooded with requests for reservations. On New Year's Eve, hundreds of persons will throng the armory for the inaugural military ball.

The ceremonies of the inauguration proper will begin New Year's morning with the military parade in which units of the New York National Guard and the New York Naval Militia from all parts of the state will participate.

At noon, after all guests of honor have been announced by the sergeant-at-arms of the state assembly, and seated on the platform with the formal permission of the secretary of state, the governor-elect will enter the capital with his honorary escort.

Franklin D. Roosevelt will be introduced to the audience in the assembly chamber by the retiring governor, Alfred E. Smith. This constitutes an innovation in the history of the inauguration.

The governor-elect will be introduced by the secretary of state. Governor Smith's address will be not only one of introduction, but something also of a valedictory.

It will be his farewell to the people of New York state after a quarter of a century of almost unbroken service on Capitol Hill. Then the governor-elect will

GHOSTLY SISTERS OF MANILA PROWL AFTER NIGHTFALL

By Egan Hoskins (Associated Press Correspondent) MANILA, Jan. 5.—Four of those black-robed, headless sisters, whose superstition says, are spreading death in Manila and its suburbs, has caused the thousands of Filipinos to mark the front doors of their homes with white crosses.

The story of the headless sisters, who are called the Tandang Marinas, or Three Marys, began to circulate a few weeks ago. It spread like wild fire and today full 75 per cent of the homes in and around Manila are marked with crosses.

Most of the crosses have been placed on the crosses on their doors, the crosses are hanging, brightly colored, and the person who owns their knock at the door will be struck with fatal illness. But, if a white cross is upon the door the sisters will pass that residence by.

Even more incredible, and also more terrifying, is a superstition disclosed in a recent Philippine consular report from Davao, Mindanao, in the southern part of archipelago.

The report said that a Chinese store owner and three other persons had been killed by the Atas, a pagan mountain tribe, to fulfill a superstition that a wife must be buried with the hands of four murdered persons in order to enter paradise.
