WASHINGTON, Jan. 7.—(AP) Barron Collier, New York capitalist, believes that prosperity will continue through 1929. He bases his belief on the result of observations made by members of his organization in 3,500 communities, these findings being compressed by Collier into a book, "How is Business in the United States?" the first copy of which was presented today to President Coolidge.

Mr. Collier said that there had been marked improvement shown in agricultural regions of the middle and northwestern sections and that the weakest spots were in the coal regions and parts of the lumber, fruit and vineyard sections.
