## DOCTOR WOUNDED BY NICARAGUANS IN JUNGLE FIGHT

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, Jan. 15.—(AP)—A sudden flaring of bandit activity in the northern jungles has resulted in the wounding of an American medical officer and the killing of two guardsmen.

Lieutenant William H. Smith, medical officer, and three members of the Guardia Nacional (the American officered national guard) were wounded. It was believed that several of the outlaws had been killed.

The clash occurred in the vicinity of San Juan de Telpaneca in the province of Nueva Segovia near the Honduran border. The outlaws were armed with a machine gun and bombs. One of the bombs struck Lieutenant Smith on the side of the head and a bullet also hit him. His wounds are not serious.

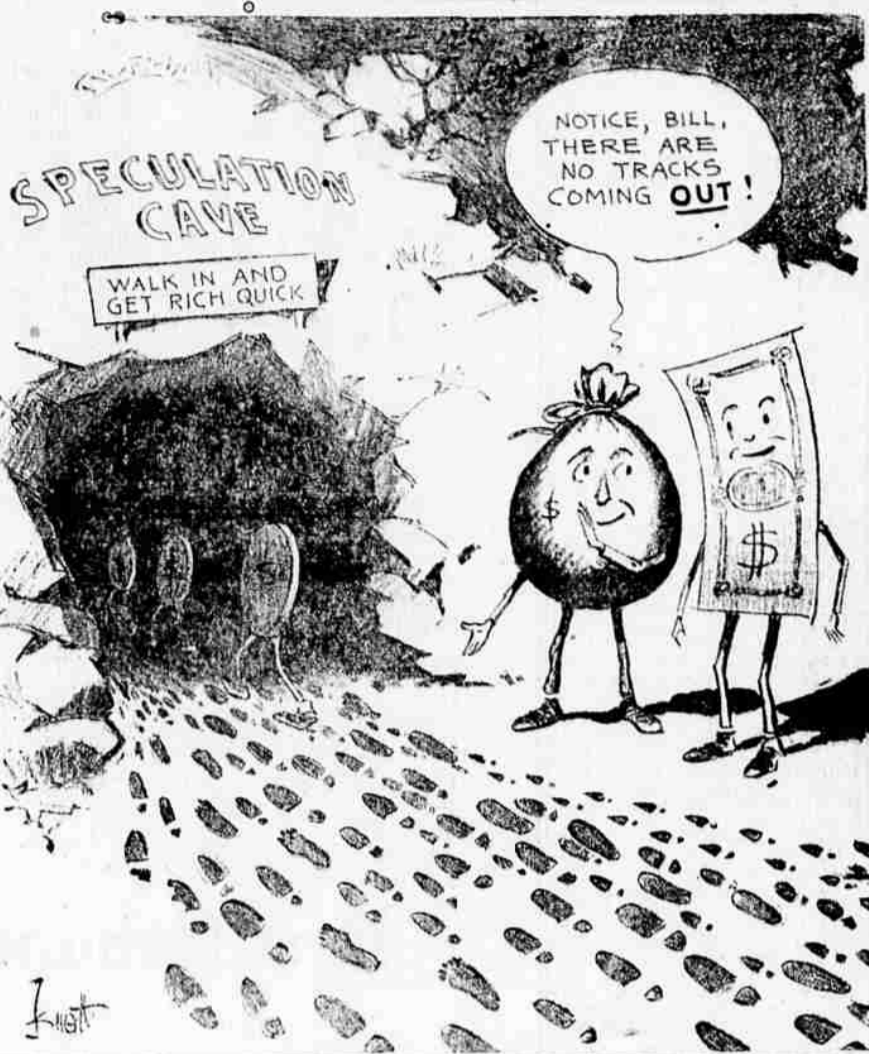
The jungle where the fighting occurred was so thick that the size of the bandit group could not be determined, although it was believed they numbered at least 100.

The dead guardsmen were buried near the scene of the battle. The wounded were transported on the backs of mules to Apala, where there is an airplane landing field. They were brought to Managua from there by plane.

## Farm Pointers

Oil emulsions applied during the dormant period are effective against the San Jose scale, the oyster shell scale, the scurfy scale and the terrapin scale. Applied as a delayed dormant spray, oil will control certain scale insects and is of special value in killing the eggs of the green apple aphid, the rosy apple aphid, the leaf roller and red spider mite. Oil is safely applied, however, only when the temperature is above 40 degrees.

Although some flint corn varieties in trials at the experiment station have made leafy and fine stalked silage, far better yields are obtained in most sections of Oregon in other varieties. In the

Willamette valley the McKay yellow dent has proved the highest yielding silage variety for five years. The standard grain variety is acclimated strains of Minnesota 13. The latter is also used for silage in sections where early maturity is a factor.

Raspberry rust is causing considerable loss among Oregon red raspberry canes, according to frequent communications to the experiment station. This rust causes lesions on the stem, which brings about breakage when the canes are tied up to trellises. Nothing can be done at this season of the year in the way of control, but losses may be reduced earlier through removing old canes promptly and cleaning up fallen leaves and other refuse. Such sanitary measures usually keep the disease from becoming serious.

## SCIENTISTS UNDERGO JUNGLE ADVENTURES IN FRENCH CAPITAL

PARIS, France, Jan. 15.—(AP)—Many of the adventures of the jungle were the lot, in the city of Paris, of the two scientists who discovered a new yellow fever serum.

They worked with big African monkeys, a kind difficult to handle at any time, but rendered both savage and deadly by yellow fever inoculation. Almost alone they carried on, Professor Auguste Pettit and Dr. Georges Stefanopoulos, living in a big room on the third floor of the Pasteur Institute here, with about 50 monkeys and several hundred guinea pigs as companions.

Frequently they could get no assistance for mental tasks, so dangerous was their work. At the crucial period of the experiments Dr. Stefanopoulos slept night after night on a cot near the monkey cages.

Three or four times nightly he rose to examine the condition of the infected animals. If a monkey seemed near death he chloroformed it quickly in order not to lose the yellow fever virus, for when dead the monkeys yield no virus.

He and the professor cleaned the cages and fed the monkeys. During inoculations Stefanopoulos held the animals, while Professor Pettit, wearing thick gloves, handled the medicines. Even with this protection, Pettit has been bitten three times within the last year.

A rifle always stood handy, for occasionally a monkey broke away. On several occasions monkeys got out of the windows and ran over adjoining roofs with a hunting party in pursuit.

Recently additional funds have enabled the scientists to install window bars and to get assistants. Their serum has been tested at the Institute and they have notified the Academy of Medicine that it is a success as a preventive and as a cure.
