

ERIC V. HAUSER, SR. PORTLAND BUILDER CALLED BY DEATH

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 17.—(AP) After an illness of several weeks Eric V. Hauser, Sr., financier, hotelman and builder, died at a hospital here last night. He was 62 years old. Influenza, following a general breakdown of health, was the cause of death.

Tentative funeral plans are for a service at a private chapel at 10 o'clock with interment in Riverside cemetery.

Mr. Hauser came to Portland in 1918 from Minneapolis and shortly after purchased the Multnomah hotel here. Up to a short time ago he had been its active head.

As president of the Hauser construction company, Mr. Hauser directed a number of extensive construction projects in the northwest. One of the most recent contracts was the building of the roadbed for the Oregon Trunk railway from Bend to Paulina.

In 1906 he started construction of the Spokane, Portland & Seattle railway down the north bank of the Columbia river, and completed it in three years.

With a son, Eric, Jr., Mr. Hauser was interested in hotels in Ashland, Ore., and Pullman and Vancouver, Wash.

He was born in Minneapolis, December 19, 1864. He is survived by his widow, three sons, Robert, Kenneth and Eric, Jr., and a daughter, Mrs. William Farner of St. Paul, Minn.

FIGHTING CONTINUED BY AFGHAN REBELS

LONDON, Jan. 17.—(AP) London newspapers said today that they had learned in authoritative circles here that serious fighting was continuing in and around Kabul, Afghanistan despite the abdication of Amanullah as king.

The daily mail said that the rebels did not approve of King Inayatullah, Amanullah's successor, any more than they did of his younger brother.

The daily express said that a grim and ferocious battle was turning Kabul into a shambles. Parviz Sakka, the rebel commander, refused to regard the situation as a reason for laying down his arms.

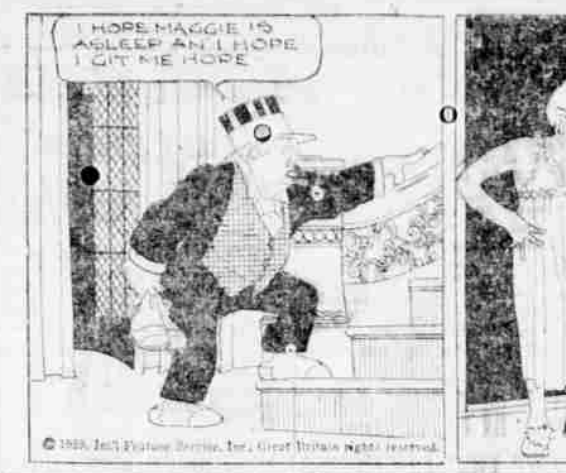
