'DIVVY' SCENE IN KEYES' PRESENCE RELATED TO JURY

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Jan. 18.—(AP)—John Rettinger, who testified that he saw a roll of bills three inches thick divided by Ben Getzoff between former District Attorney Aza Keyes and Charles Bremer, stuck to his story under cross-examination by defense attorneys here today for the stand for the state in the bribery trial of Keyes and five co-defendants. However, Rettinger admitted a discrepancy in his testimony before the grand jury two months ago.

It was Ed Rosenberg, then a defendant in the Julian fraud case, who gave Rettinger the money which the state contends went to "fix" the case, Rettinger maintained today. He testified, when Le Compte Davis, veteran of the defense, pointed out to him that before the grand jury he had said that Jack Rosenberg handled the check, that he must have been "confused" concerning the first name of the brothers.

Both Jack and Ed Rosenberg are defendants with Keyes, but only Rosenberg was being tried in the Julian case.

Meticulous questioning failed to shake other portions of Rettinger's testimony, and he repeated that Ben Getzoff told him when he laid \$10,000 bills on a sewing machine while his suit was being pressed that the money came from Jacob Berman and that \$7,000 more was expected immediately. Berman, formerly a defendant with Keyes, turned state's evidence against the former prosecutor, and testified that he paid upwards of \$40,000 to "fix" criminal cases against him through Getzoff to Keyes.

ADOPT NEW RULE FOR LOCAL GAMES

In order to prevent "crashing" the gates at local basketball games, a rigid rule has been adopted at the high school. The only people to be admitted free of charge will be the letter men in school and those presenting passes issued by either Principal B. H. Conkle or Coach Frank Callison.

'TWILIGHT SLEEP' FATAL; HEADS OF HOME ON GRILL

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Jan. 18.—(AP)—Charges of manslaughter in connection with the death of an 18-year-old girl in the New Mexico girls welfare home, a state corrective institution, following an injection of twilight sleep, were expected to be filed today against Mrs. Bertha Lips, superintendent at the home, and Dr. Evelyn Fralich, who administered the injection.

A possibility of federal action in the case was seen in an investigation started yesterday by J. C. Pieper, a government operative to determine whether the injection of the relative was in violation of the Arizona anti-narcotic act.

The dead girl, Helen Hawkey, of Portales, N. M., was one of a group of six girls who escaped from the institution last week. The girls were recaptured Friday and placed in solitary confinement on a bread and water diet, and at the request it was brought out that the water was impregnated with salt-peter.

On Saturday night the six caused a disturbance in their cells and were given injections to quiet them.

TOOK DRINK WITH A NEAT DRESSER

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 18.—(AP)—Believed to have been drugged by the same well-dressed man who has victimized three others within the past week, John Smith of Boise, Idaho, told his story to police today.

The stranger, he said, met him Wednesday and offered him a job on the east side. After they had crossed a bridge about, the man offered him a drink. He remained unconscious Thursday night on the river bank. His savings of \$30 were gone.

Police here are searching for the man.

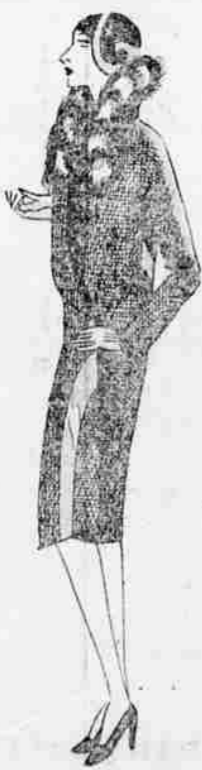
