

EASIER MONEY ON WALL STREET HAS BULL INFLUENCE

NEW YORK, Jan. 22.—(AP)—The stock market responded to slightly easier money today with a vigorous upturn, particularly in the metal and motor shares and specialties. More than a score of issues were limited to new high ground. The old DuPont stock recording a maximum gain of 90 points.

Call money was in supply at an official rate of six percent, which was shaded to five in the outside market, and bankers expressed the opinion that higher rates would be improbable until the end of the month.

Buying orders rolled into the market in heavy volume during the last hour, the utilities encountering particular favor. Johns-Manville extended its gain to nearly 20 points, touching 223. Adams Express made an extreme gain of 14 points, and American Smelting of 7. Matheson Alkali jumped more than 11 points and Commercial Solvents 6. The closing was strong. Total sales approximated 5,000,000 shares.
