WAR VETERANS GIVEN JOB PREFERENCE BY CARKIN'S PROPOSAL

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 24.—(Special)—World war veterans, who have been honorably discharged, are given preference with Civil and Spanish-American war veterans for appointment and employment in every public department and upon all public works of the state in the provisions of a bill introduced in the house of representatives by Representative John H. Carkin of Medford. The proposed bill is an act to amend section 2395, Oregon laws, relating to preference on public contracts. Heretofore, the law, which was passed in 1913, only included Civil and Spanish-American war veterans.
