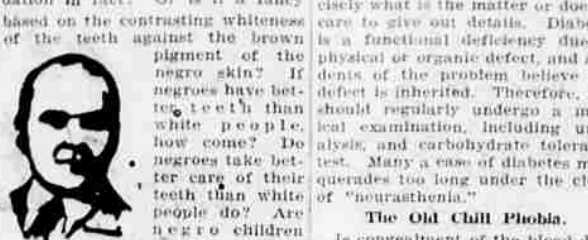

HAVE NEGROES BETTER TEETH? It is the common belief that negroes have finer teeth than white people. Has this belief any foundation in fact? Or is it a fancy based on the contrasting whiteness of the teeth against the brown pigment of the negro skin?
