Father of French Beauty Is American

Throwing on her own resources she apprenticed herself to a milliner. Although she did not attain the heights achieved by her illustrious predecessor in the hat trade, Mme. DuBarry, as the uncrowned queen of Versailles, she did become the queen of the Paris art world. Struck by her charms, when seen at the Four Arts ball, J. J. Shubert engaged her for the current tour of "Gay Paris."

JUNIOR HI LIBRARY BOOK EXCHANGE IS OPENED FOR SCHOOLS

The public school authorities announce that a change has been made in the second-hand book exchange plan which has been carried on in the elementary and junior high schools. Instead of attempting to handle a small exchange business in each elementary school, this work has been centralized with the junior high school librarian. Parents or pupils desiring to buy or sell second-hand books will go to that building instead.

The new change gives the pupils better opportunity to dispose of books; also a better opportunity for selection in purchasing. No commission or fee of any kind is charged for handling the books accepted for sale. The service is given free by the librarian, Miss Andrews, who has for the past two years handled the junior book exchange.

Second-hand school books will continue to be handled as usual in the high school exchange.
