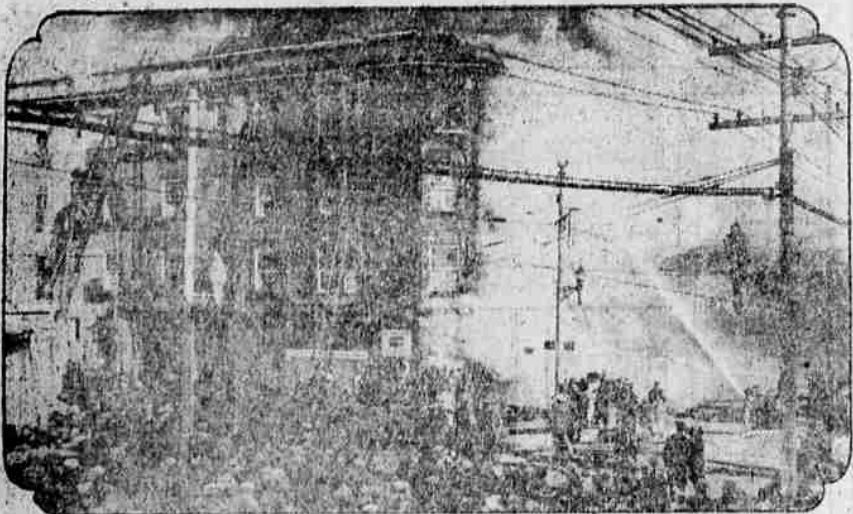

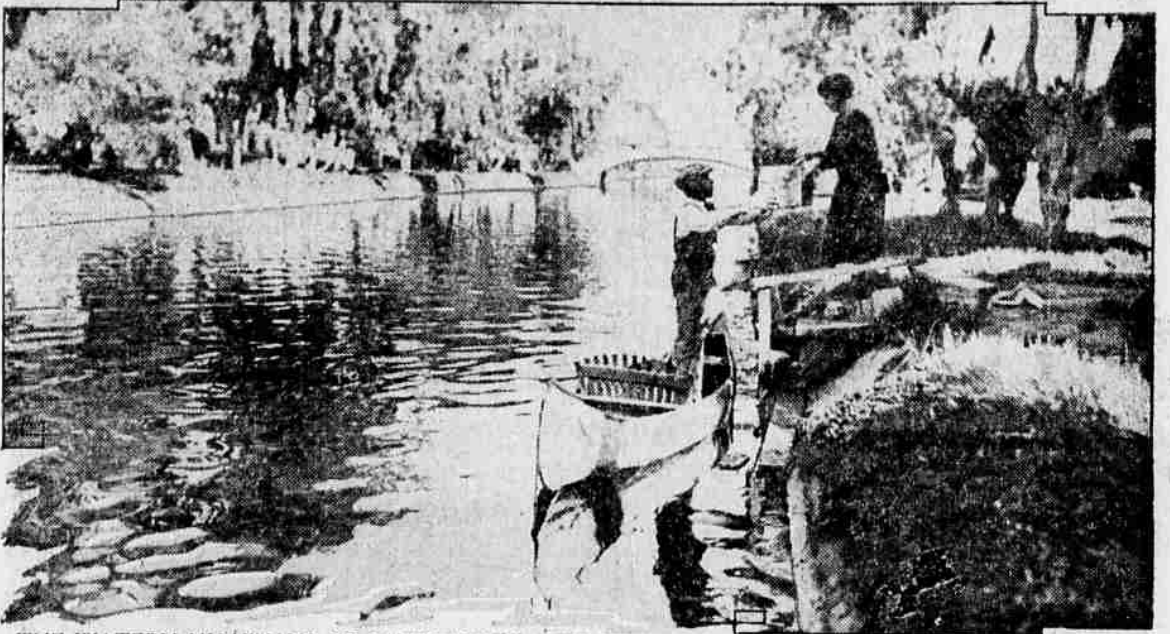

JUST BACK from Europe, Miss Beatrice Harrison, well-known cellist, is photographed as her steamer docks in New York.



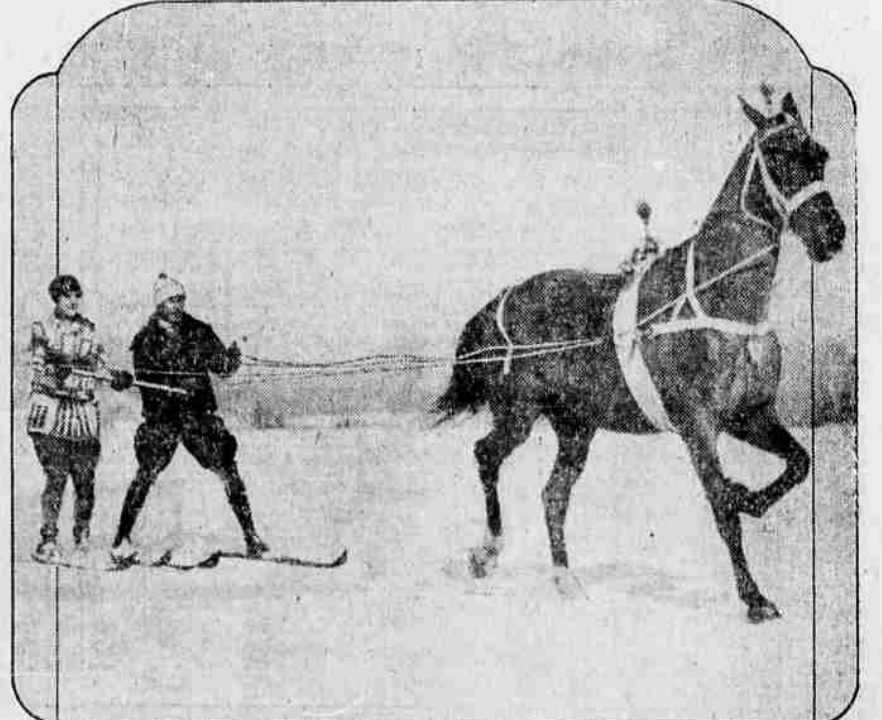

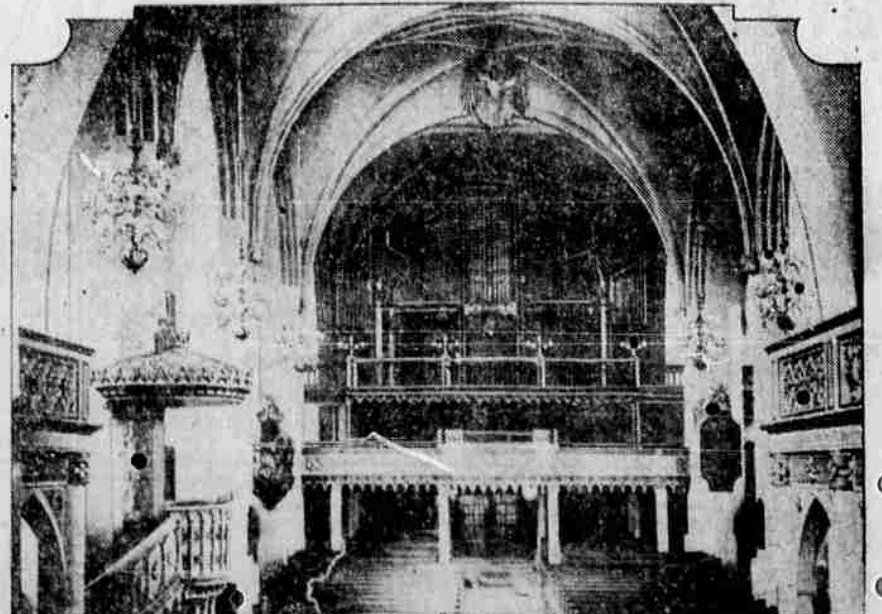
