

PLAN FOR HARBOR AT CRESCENT CITY INTERESTS IDAHO

Showing that the formation of the Northern California-Southern Oregon Development association, formed here last month is attracting widespread attention, a front page editorial was recently printed in the Idaho Capitol News of Boise, Idaho, urging Idaho to take a deeper interest in the construction of the Crescent City Harbor in the thought that it will help western Idaho in a closer east-west connection.

The editorial is as follows: "Business men of southern Oregon and northern California have organized the Northern California-Southern Oregon Development association.

This organization is greatly interested in a cross-state railroad through central Oregon to Ontario, there to connect with the Union Pacific system.

And it is also interested in the construction of a cross-state highway through central Oregon to connect with the east and west highway in this state.

Incidentally it purposes to develop another water port at Crescent City on the north California coast in the development of which the federal government is assisting.

J. R. Harvey, secretary of the association, writing on the subject, says among other things:

"At the present time we are shipping all our produce east, either by way of Portland and the Columbia river, through Seattle to Granger, or south to Sacramento, then east to Granger.

"The route via Portland and Pasco is 240 miles and by Sacramento 450 miles longer to Granger than a cross-state road would be, which we are working for from this district through a point near Klamath Falls up to Ontario.

"To this end we intervened in the hearing before the Interstate Commerce commission. This hearing was started by the public service commission of Oregon, and is a request for an order to build a road from Crater Lake, Ore., to the Odell lake district.

"In other words, to an intersection of the line between Bend and Klamath Falls. This would give western Idaho a short haul into northern California and San Francisco.

Regarding the state highway project, Mr. Harvey says:

"We are also interested in a road practically parallel with this from the Yellowstone park, west through your district and then through southern Oregon counties to a point near Crater Lake, connecting with the Dunes-Columbia highway.

"Each of these projects directly connect this west coast up with your district and open a vast territory to you and us. It would save us three days on shipments east, which is very important, especially to our fruit crops, pears and apples, which we ship to New York and Boston every year.

"With the building of a port, which the government now has under construction at Crescent City, you would have another port for your commodities, and a new territory open to you."

Here is a proposition western Idaho should look into.

There is a well defined determination to develop short cuts to the west, either by rail or highway. It is certainly to the interest of all southern Idaho that every possible avenue be opened to get our produce onto western markets.

The development of a port at Crescent City in northern California is of more than passing importance to this interior section. And a direct line into it is not so visionary as it appears.

Boise and all western Idaho and eastern Oregon should interest themselves in the plans of the Northern California and Southern Oregon Development association.
