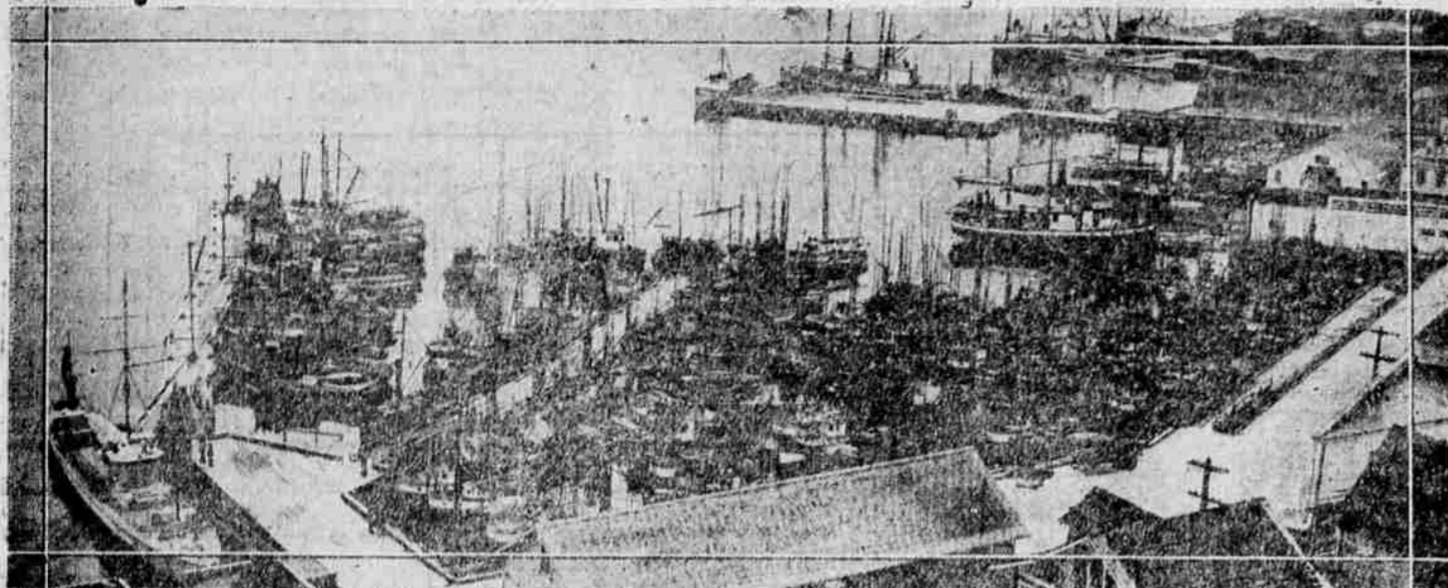

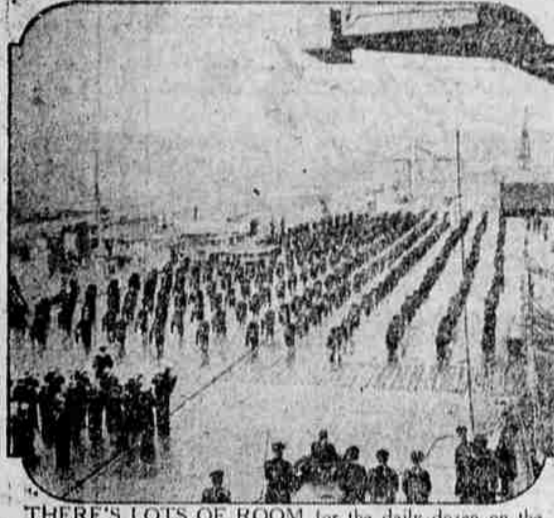

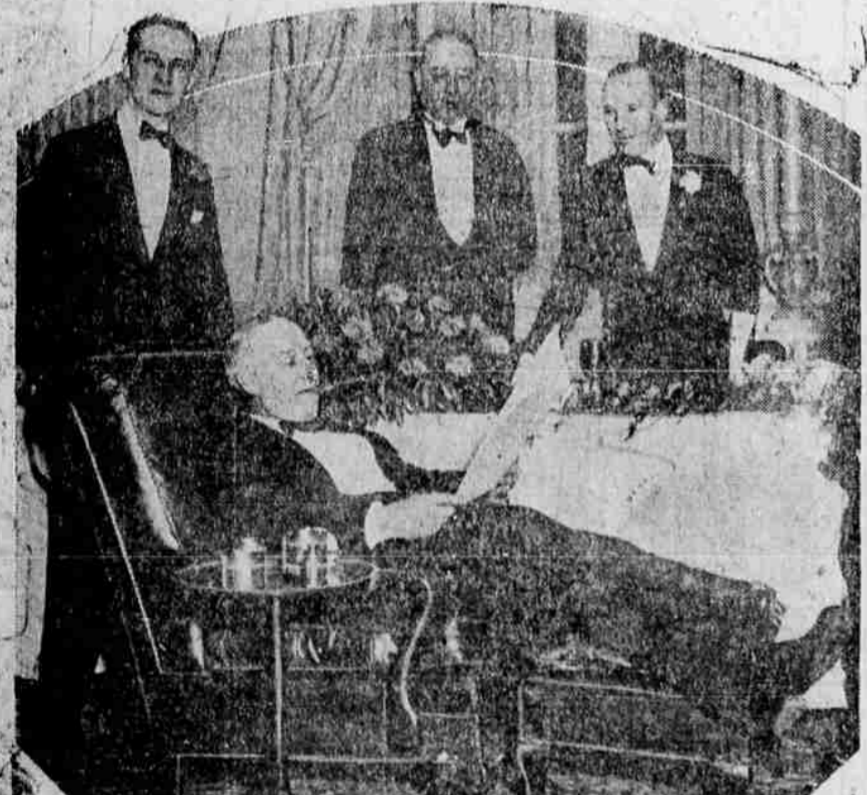

HOME AGAIN, the famous Duncan sisters—Vivian, left, and Rosetta—reach New York after an European engagement and prepare to appear again on the American stage.



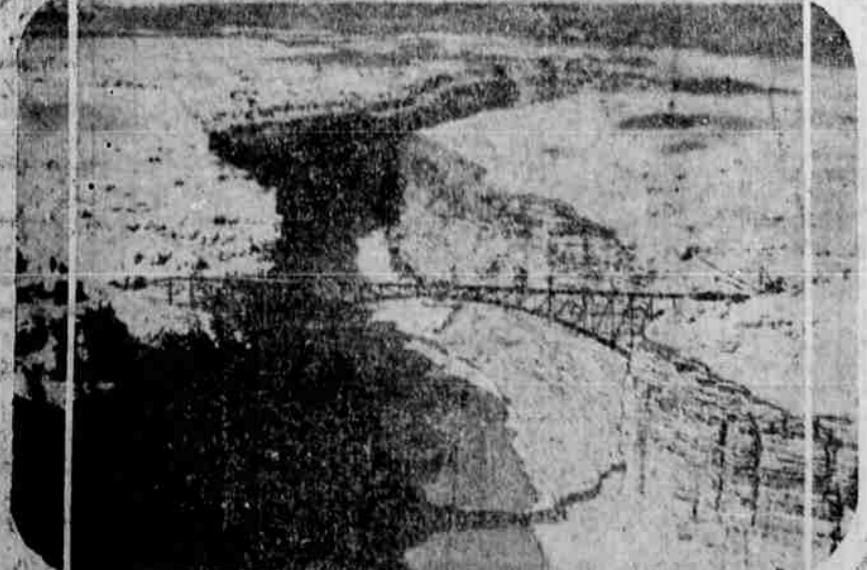
