**FAMILY PERISHES IN POWDER BLAST**

BUCKHANNON, W. V., Feb. 4.—A can of blasting powder, placed in front of an open grate to dry, was believed to be the cause of ten persons being burned to death shortly after midnight Saturday.

The blaze practically wiped out an entire family. Those dead are: Pete Simms, a miner; his wife and six children, Solomon, 17; Hiram, 14; Ernest, 10; Harold, 8; Mabel, 4; and Ida Jane, 3; a married daughter, Mrs. Troy Gibson, and her three-month-old infant. Mrs. Gibson's husband escaped with severe burns.

As the fire raged firemen stood helplessly by, their firing no water to combat the flames. The dwelling was located on the outskirts of Buckhannon and outside the hydrant zone.

Neighbors told fire officials that an explosion preceded the fire. This gave rise to the belief Simms was drying out powder for his work in the coal mines. Gibson was unable to tell a coherent story, shock and body burns being so severe as to cause his name being placed on the danger list at a hospital.

Fire officials said that when the embers had cooled sufficiently an investigation would be made and they were confident their open hearth would be substantiated.

### SIMPLICITY ASKED BY BRAVE WOMAN IN FUNERAL RITES

PHOENIX, Ariz., Feb. 4.—(AP)—The dying wish of Countess de Meroles, one of the world's illustrious women, for extreme simplicity in her funeral services, will be observed here today.

The countess died Saturday of injuries from a supposedly trivial accident, after having experienced the recent and many of the physical effects of the world war in Belgium.

Two posts of the American Legion will conduct the services, following which burial will be made in a grave marked only by a simple headstone. It will bear only the name of Mrs. Charles E. Waterhouse, by which she was known in private life here after her second marriage.

Decorations for her war service were bestowed upon Countess de Meroles by France, England and Belgium. As a first lieutenant commanding a field hospital near Ypres, she was gassed twice, a shell broke her back, and another threw away her face, which later was restored by plastic surgery. Her husband was killed in action the day they entered war service.

In a strange contrast was the cause of her death. Last October she was struck accidentally by a youth on a bicycle and from those injuries she died. The countess was 42 years of age.

### SHOT FIRED AT NEW HONDURAN PRESIDENT
