

SOUTH AMERICANS HAVE GERMAN BID AIR DEVELOPMENT.

BERLIN—(AP) Germany's aircraft industry will be high and vigorously for a lion's share of the South American demand. The move will be aimed at powerful French competitors. Germans have done much pioneer work in the development of aerial transportation in various South American republics. In the first ten months of 1928, 10 German machines were shipped to Brazil, where the Condor Syndicate maintains a regular service from Rio Janeiro to Rio Grande do Sul, with planned extension to Montevideo and Buenos Aires, while a German group in Peru has secured a concession for establishing air services with neighboring countries. In Bolivia the Aero Lloyd Volcaniano, a German enterprise operating with a German staff and German machines, conducts that country's air services. In Colombia five air lines totaling over 1000 miles are operated by the Sociedad Colombo Alemana Transportes Aereos, a company founded under German auspices in 1920, which has extended its operations into Ecuador and pays 12 per cent dividend on its capital. Prospects of further developments of German interests in the South American air services are said to be extremely bright.

HUMPHRIES GETS BOOST BY BOEING

SEATTLE, Feb. 5.—(Special, by Air Mail.) Assistant to the president in charge of transportation, at Seattle, is the post assigned to A. K. Humphries, former vice president and general manager of Pacific Air Transport, by P. G. Johnson, president of Boeing Air Transport and Pacific Air Transport. The announcement was made at executive offices here today. Mr. Humphries enlisted at the first call for volunteers in the world war, and went overseas with the Third Foreign detachment of American aviators, as a first lieutenant in Italy and France, completing a course of aerial combat at Issoudun, and received various special commissions. After the armistice, he served on the American peace commission, (war reparations committee in Italy), and in 1919, was detailed to the Balkan states and Hungary with the American relief commission. Upon his return to the United States, he joined a Seattle mercantile company, where he remained several years. When Vern C. Coast was awarded the Seattle-Los Angeles air mail contract in 1926, Humphries became vice president and general manager.

OUTDOOR GARAGE ENDS CHICAGO PARK PLANS

CHICAGO, (AP)—The world's largest outdoor parking area might have been a beautiful section of Grant park if Chicago's traffic problem had not been so acute. Parking was prohibited in the loop before the park commissioners had realized their plans to improve and enlarge Grant park's lake front territory. Immediately there arose a demand to allow parking in the unfinished area of the park—including more than a million square feet. Now 4000 cars find an outdoor garage in Grant park. The park commissioners wonder if their beautification program ever will be a reality.

KDKA Announcer III. PITTSBURGH, Feb. 5.—(AP)—A voice that has been heard by millions of radio listeners from the Arctic wastes to the frozen stretches of the Antarctic, is stifled for the present. It is that owned by Louis Kaufman, chief announcer of Westinghouse station KDKA. Kaufman, a victim of pneumonia, is reported as "sinking rapidly" at his home here.

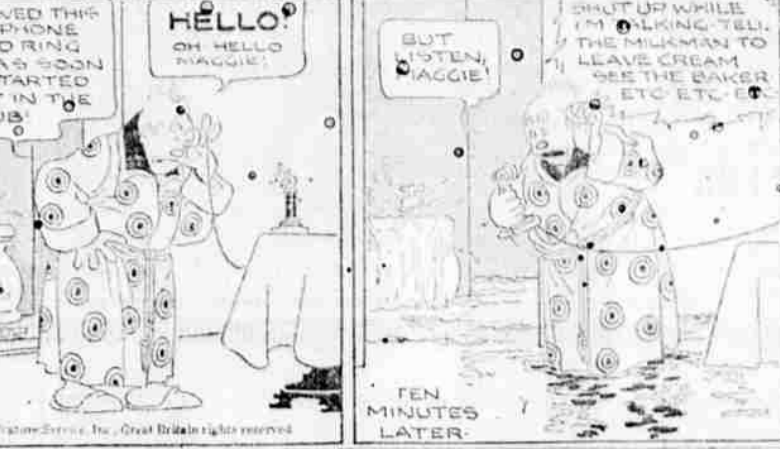
