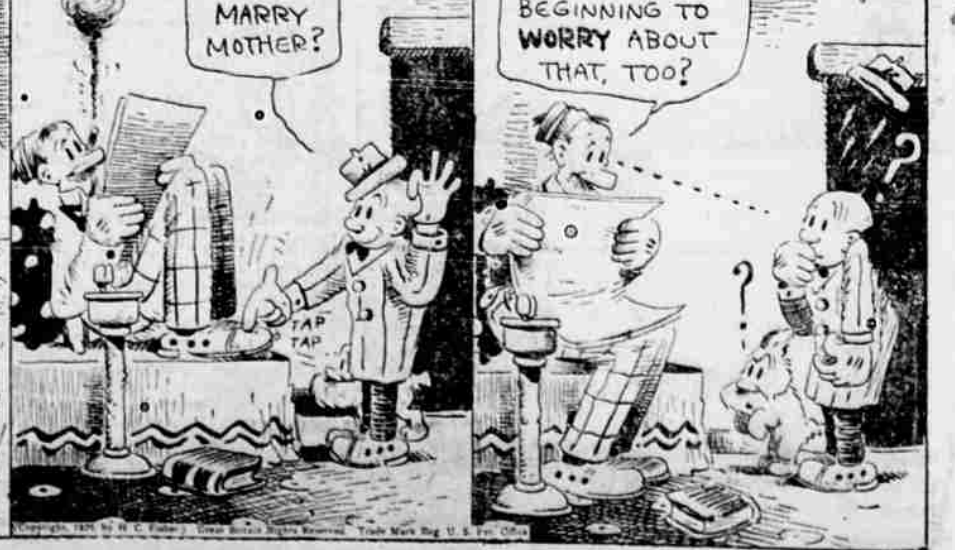

SAN FRAN AIRCRAFT PLANT TO PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 5.—(AP)—George H. Wisting, manager of the industries department of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, announced today that the Breeze Aircraft corporation has purchased the Watts airport at Beaverton, near here, and plans to move its plant from San Francisco at once. The airport investment is said to be \$75,000. Orders for machinery and equipment for the factory have been placed, Wisting said, and uncompleted planes in the San Francisco plant will be shipped here for completion. Nelson E. Jones, general manager of the company, said the firm expects to produce 50 planes during the first year amounting to \$500,000 in sales price.
