Only eight votes were cast against the measure, in support of which both Speaker Hamilton and Representative Caran, chairman of the property tax relief commission, took the floor.

Interest in the house centered, however, in the 91 bills which were slipping into the house hopper to get under the wire before the 20th day deadline the introduction of measures. The deluge of proposals brought the number of bills introduced in the house during the session to 406.

Bus Bill Offered Representative Goldstein of Multnomah offered house bill 292, pertaining to the certificates of necessity and convenience under which established motor bus and truck lines are operating and requiring that new lines seeking to enter the field in Oregon must file their applications with the state public service commission, which shall hold hearings on the application after receiving notice of such hearings upon the cities and towns and competing transportation lines and shall grant or deny the permission sought upon the basis of necessity and public convenience to be served by the establishment of competing services.

In the legislative hall the bill is referred to the Southern Pacific bill, and its authorship is credited to attorneys for that railroad, which during the past two years has established and purchased extensive bus lines paralleling its railroad routes in the state.
