UNCOVER RELICS IN INDIAN GRAVE NEAR GOLD HILL

By Asil Walker. GOLD HILL, Ore., Feb. 7.—(Special)—A number of exceptional specimens of Indian relics have been unearthed near Gold Hill on the ranch owned by W. W. Hittle.

The relics were found while the land was being leveled. Among the things unearthed are old Indian pipes, several skeletons and a number of arrowheads and spear points.

The pipes which were found are hewn out of solid stone. They are about 19 to 25 inches in length and about an inch in diameter. They are made straight with a large hole at each end and cut down in the center. About 19 or 12 of these pipes were unearthed.

A number of skeletons were uncovered at the same spot where the pipes were found. They are still solid, although some of them fairly well decayed. An exceptionally large number of arrowheads were also taken out, some of them perfect specimens.

The center of the stones indicated that it must have taken plenty of time to make one of them. At the bit end of the pipes they were cut out, as the pipes are made nowadays and regular mouthpieces were made at the end of them. A number of large bowls cut out of solid rock have also been found near the place where the other articles were taken out.

The specimens also present an interesting study of the burial of the Indians. The spot at which the articles were taken out is stated by some of the earlier residents of this valley to be an old burial ground. One of the main trails of the Indians is to bury their belongings including beads, arrows, bows, gold and other articles in their possession with their chief when he dies.

Unfortunately a few of the pipes were broken when the articles were first uncovered by the scraper with which the land is being leveled, but several were taken out which are practically perfect. A number of the articles taken out are on display in the window of the Bowers Pharmacy in this city.

ASHLAND, Ore., Feb. 7.—(Special)—The Ashland chamber of commerce board of directors met with the new secretary, Geo. H. Moser, and outlined a plan, at Mr. Moser's suggestion, for reducing the number of standing committees from 29 to 6 and providing for the appointment of special committees at various times when particular problems come up.
