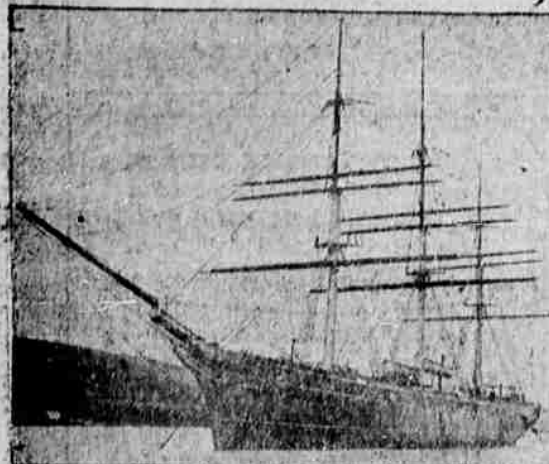


# NEWS of the DAY in PICTURES

NEWEST FIND of the movie kings is beautiful Lily Damita, European actress, who made a strong hit in her first American film appearance.



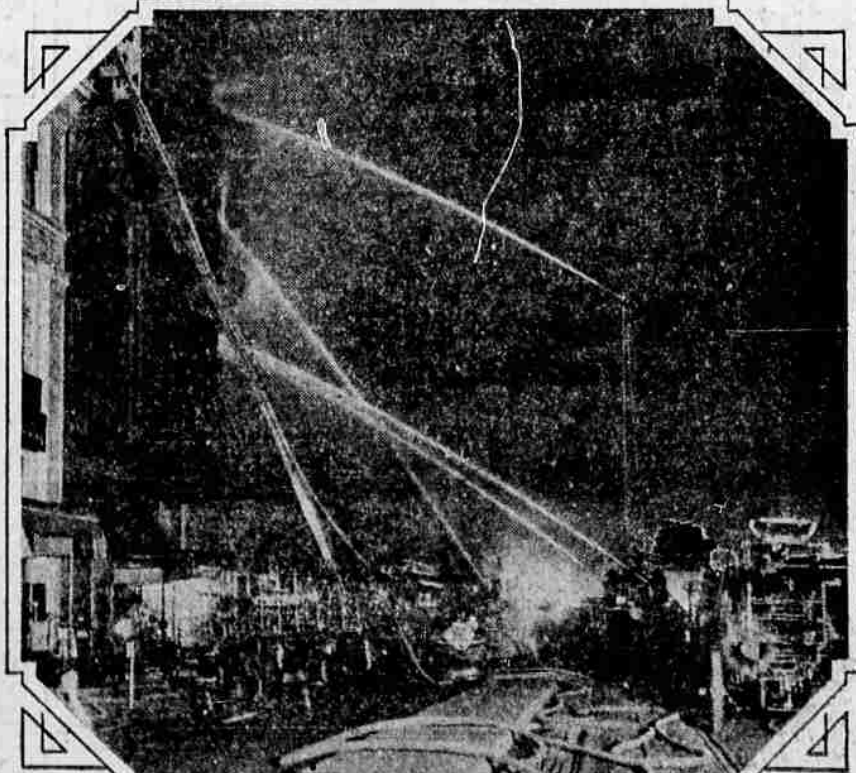

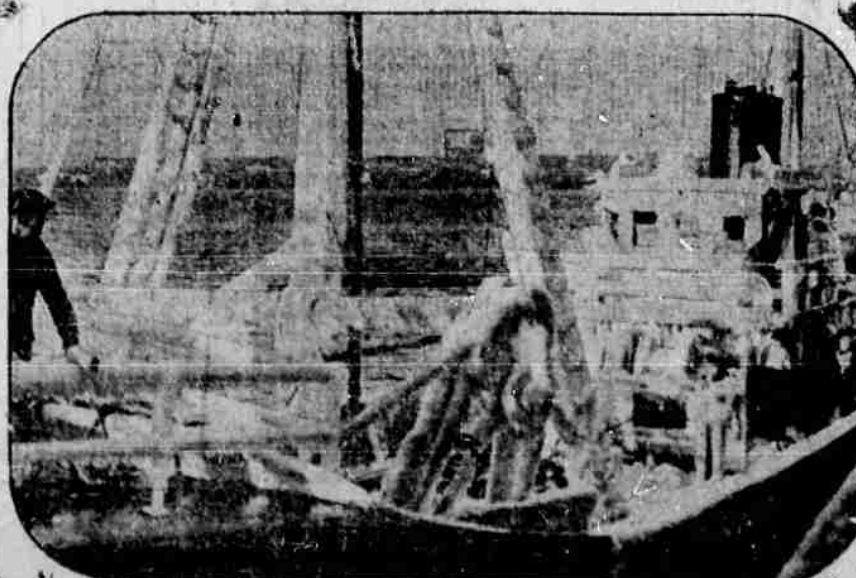
